WASHINGTON — Opponents of a Texas judge picked by President Reagan to be the youngest member of the federal bench urged the Senate to reject the nominee Tuesday for showing a callous insensitivity to

voting rights. Sen. Howard Metzenbaum, D-Ohio, said Sidney A. Fitzwater's participation in a 1982 Republican Party 'ballot security" campaign to warn voters against committing election fraud was "one of the most invidious and repugnant political tactics that I have seen in years.

Signs carrying a warning in bright red letters that "You Can Be Imprisoned" for election law violations were posted in mostly-black election

Metzenbaum read a letter to Dallas election officials from Assistant Attorney General Bradford Reynolds, the Justice Department's civil rights enforcement chief, noting that an investigation by the department found that the signs had only been placed in black neighborhoods.

Reynolds wrote there was no history of voting fraud in the precincts where the signs were posted, Metzenbaum said.

'When Brad Reynolds indicates there has been discrimination, there must have been discrimination because it's a well known and accepted fact that Brad Reynolds has not been in the forefront of the battle against discrimination," Metzenbaum said.
