OMB proposes funding cuts in research

to consult with the academic community before making revisions.

"It appears that what we say or do won't make a difference," she said.

"I think it's an attempt to make a quick control, a quick control of cost," she said.

But, Treat said, this revision is a permanent solution to a temporary budget problem.

The OMB should have cut the research funds and let the universities apply the cut to themselves, she said.

"They're making decisions for us," Treat said.

But Anderson said he believes the revision is useful.

"I cannot oppose the revision," he said.

"After I've come to understand it," Anderson said, "I think it's a reasonable approach to limiting administrative cost as a portion of the overhead."

"Some universities have a relatively high administrative cost."

"This is a drag on research. It's a drag on the researchers themselves and on the overall program."

"If you understand it thoroughly, understand the purpose and realize that many universities have been abusing this overhead category, this seems like a very welcome and needed reform."

"Many people will look at this revision as a welcome change because it will force universities to squeeze down and make their administrative cost more efficient."

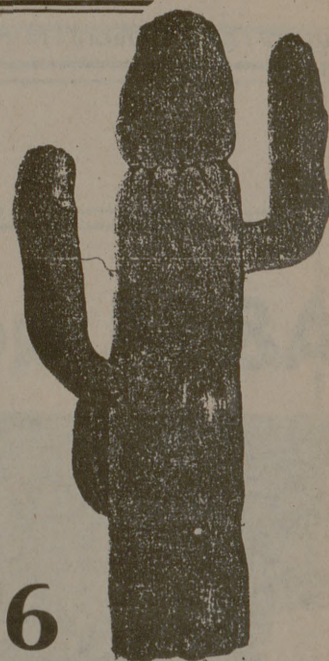

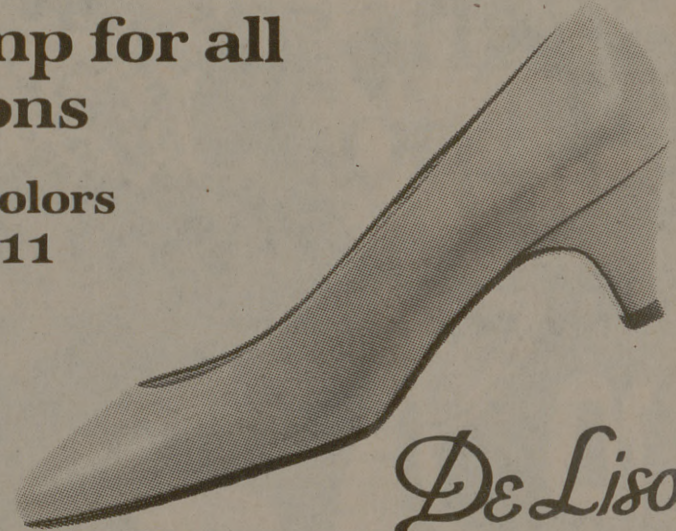

thing comes up that would show that there might be any prospect or any profit in doing that."

After conferring with Habib, Reagan met privately with about a half-dozen congressmen to try to win their votes.

Afterwards, Rep. Roy Rowland, D-Ga., said Reagan "said that they're looking at some alternatives to the \$100 million, and he said, 'I can't

give you the specifics on that now.' But they are looking at some alternatives."

At this point, the administration says it faces an uphill fight to win the money. The Democratic-controlled House is scheduled to vote March 19 on the package, while the Republican-led Senate is tentatively scheduled to vote the next day.

House Speaker Thomas P. O'Neill Jr., D-Mass., said he still expects Reagan's aid request to be defeated and

that "there are no deals as far as I'm concerned."

Escorting Habib to his car in the White House driveway, Reagan said the United States is "still seeking some openings in negotiations with the Sandinistas" but that "nine times now, they have refused."

Asked about assertions that the United States is not interested in a negotiated settlement for Nicaragua, Reagan replied, "The critics have been making ridiculous noises for a long time and that's one of the most ridiculous."

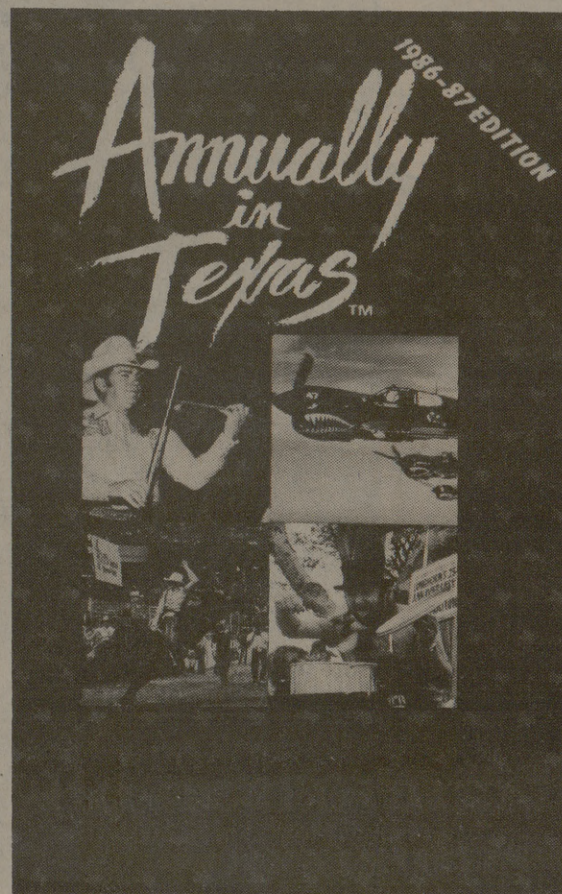
