

Raveling, 48, has a record of 221-174 in 11 years at Washington State and the last three years at Iowa. His Hawkeye teams were 13-15, 21-11 and 20-12, losing in the first round of the NCAA tournament this year and

Raveling first met with Houston officials a week ago, along with Stanford University Coach Tom Davis. "It's an important decision they have to make there, and I understand what they're going through," Davis

Asked if he would take the job if offered, Davis said, "I really don't know. There are a lot of things to recommend it.'

Navy Coach Paul Evans, who also was being considered for the UH post, was named head coach at Pittsburgh Wednesday.
