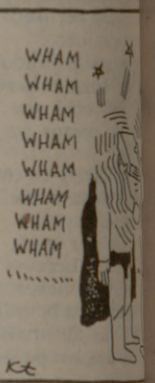
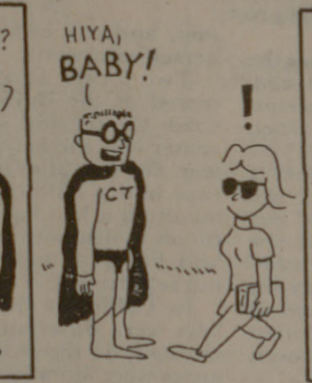
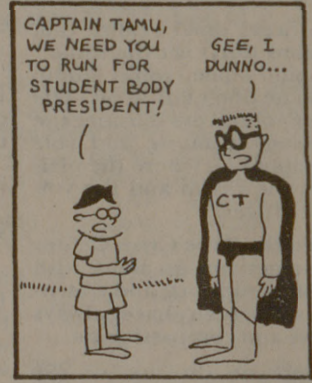

## Singer says song in memo of shuttle crew may debut

HOUSTON (AP) — Singer John Denver says a song he wrote in memory of the Challenger astronauts may have its debut during a special benefit for the astronauts' children.

"I would like very much to sing it there," Denver said in a telephone interview with the Houston Chronicle from Hawaii, where he was putting finishing touches on the song.

Denver said he wants to sing the song, called "Flying for Me," during the sold-out Challenger benefit performance scheduled for Thursday night in Houston.

The final decision, however, must be made by the sponsors of the benefit, he said.

"I will perform it for them when I arrive in Houston, and if they think it is appropriate, then we will include it Thursday night," Denver said.

The benefit is for the children of the seven Challenger astronauts who

ians who are killed or disabled in space flight.

Denver said he had a special attachment to the Challenger crew, especially New Hampshire's Christa McAuliffe, because she made the event seem more personal.

"It was one of us up there," he said. "It wasn't an astronaut; it was another person who was the incredible thing."

"I knew all of those folks, but not closely. That's why it's so meaningful to me and our achievements."

Despite what happened to the Challenger crew, Denver said he wants to go on a shuttle trip.

Denver said that in dealing with the world's problems, "For a little while, all the world things stopped, and all about our differences, problems," he said.

denied when the space shuttle exploded shortly after takeoff Jan. 28.

Thursday's performance is sponsored by the Houston Symphony Orchestra, Houston Ballet, Houston Grand Opera, Society for the Performing Arts and Theater Under the Stars' Humphreys School of Musical Theater.

The sponsors say the proceeds will be used to provide financial support and education to the astronauts' dependents and to dependents of any other NASA employees or civil-

## Builder says his use of bridge legal

WACO (AP) — The builder of a private bridge on the Brazos River says he is operating legally despite claims by county and state officials that the structure should be dismantled.

Officials said the bridge was built without authorization, impeded navigation, trespassed on the public right-of-way on the river bed and violated the county's 100-year floodplain ordinance.

John Trice, the owner of J&J Sand and Gravel Co., said he disagrees with McLennan County officials' request that the state investigate whether he is violating court orders by using the bridge, which he has been ordered to tear down.

Trice said the bridge would cut about 34 miles off a round trip to Dallas for his gravel trucks and that he will complete the road this week.

Trice testified during the hearing before building the bridge, he told by the Army Corps of Engineers to "put the bridge in the water."

The controversy over the bridge, located between Patrick and Gholsom, has captured the attention of at least eight county, state and federal agencies claiming the bridge was built illegally in March 1985.

"We are not hurting anybody or the river here," he said. "You have one or two airboaters offended because they have to slow down to go under the bridge."

In October, Trice posted a \$100,000 bond to prevent removal of the bridge until the case is complete.

The state and McLennan County sued Trice and his gravel company to prevent him from completing the structure.

State District Judge Derwood Johnson ordered Trice to dismantle the bridge after jurors ruled in favor of the state during a July trial.

But last week, County Attorney Ralph White received complaints from area residents that Trice was using the bridge to complete a roadway on the west side of the river.

Last spring, Johnson issued a temporary injunction prohibiting Trice from using the bridge, except to
