

# Southeast forest fires decrease in number

(AP) The number of forest fires raging throughout the Southeast declined Wednesday, but a major new blaze burned in Virginia and a state of emergency was declared in West Virginia, where firefighters were 'just numb" after 16 days on the job.

The toll in one of the region's worst fire seasons on record neared 600,000 acres, with some states already having lost more than in all of 1985.

At least four people have died while fighting fires, three in Tennessee and one in Ohio.

"The weather folks are saying we could have some relief by Saturday," said Bruce Jewell, spokesman for the U.S. Forest Service regional office in Atlanta.

He said the 13-state southeastern region, which extends from Texas to irginia but does not include hard-

hit West Virginia and Ohio, has been averaging 1,000 to 1,500 fires a day. "Since the first of the year, we've had approximately 43,000 fires for a total of about 580,000 acres," Jewell said. "Yesterday we reported 1,380 fires that burned 15,642 acres.

The worst fires have struck Tennessee, Kentucky, Ohio, Alabama, the Carolinas, the Virginias, and Pennsylvania.

Large forest, grass and brush fires also were reported this week in parts of Michigan, New Jersey, Massachusetts and Missouri.
