## Faculty Senate election decided

Jon J. Denton defeated James R. Woosley in a run-off for Place 4 of the College of Education, bringing Faculty Senate elections to a close Thursday.

Denton, professor of educational curriculum and instruction, received 57 votes to Woosley's 32. Woosley is a lecturer in health and physical education. Eighty-nine total ballots were cast in the only run-off of the regular Senate elections, which were held Tuesday.

The next regular session of the 86-member Senate will be April 14, at which time Sen. Harry Boothe, head of the election committee, will discuss the selection process for Senate officers and committee heads, to be elected in May.

## Smugglers show airport vulnerability

EL PASO (AP) — Security measures to prevent hijackings and terrorist attacks against commercial aircraft are not failsafe, the manager of this border city's airport said Thursday.

Three janitors accused of sneaking illegal aliens past airport security checkpoints and aboard planes were arrested this week. George Perry, manager of the El Paso International Airport, said two of the three were longtime employees and eligible for retirement.

Security is a joint effort of the Federal Aviation Administration, the airport and individual airlines, said FAA spokesman Mitch Barker in Fort Worth, headquarters for the agency's five-state southwest region.

Officials are reviewing who has access to restricted areas and minimizing the number of people in such positions, Perry said.

The three janitors — Pablo Gallegos, 61, Felix Botello, 55, and Jose Jaime Uribe, 30 — were arrested Tuesday. They were indicted by a federal grand jury in El Paso and charged with conspiring to transport, conceal, harbor and shield illegal aliens. Each was freed on \$10,000 bond.

According to U.S. Border Patrol authorities, the janitors drove illegal aliens to the airport's employee parking lot and escorted them through an employee stairway that leads to a concourse used by both American and United Airlines.

The aliens were concealed in a janitor's closet until just prior to departure time. Once on the concourse, without having passed through the security checkpoint, the aliens would obtain boarding passes with tickets previously purchased by members of the smuggling ring.

On March 22, a United Airlines employee saw some suspicious people boarding a jet.

James Selbe, associate chief Border Patrol agent in charge of the anti-smuggling unit in El Paso, said the United Airlines pilot alerted airport security, which went into the plane and brought out a couple and their infant child.

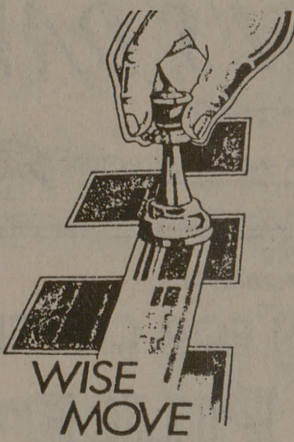

## Test uncovers genetic disorder

DALLAS (AP) — In a spin-off of work by two Nobel Prize winners, researchers here have developed a new, relatively convenient test to detect a genetic disorder that causes high levels of cholesterol.

The development could make it possible to check all patients at risk of inheriting the disorder, doctors say.

The test detects heterozygous familial hypercholesterolemia, or FH, which affects about half a mil-

lion Americans and can lead to coronary artery disease.

It was developed by researchers at the University of Texas Health Science Center at Dallas, the home of Nobel Prize-winning scientists, Drs. Michael Brown and Joseph Goldstein, genetics professors at the health science center.

Drs. Jennifer Cuthbert, Cara East and David Bilheimer described the new test in The New England Journal of Medicine.

The new test requires less than half an ounce of blood and are available within a week, she said. She said the test has been percent accurate so far in guinea pigs 12 to 15 FH patients those without cholesterol disorders.

People with heterozygous FH have on their cell surfaces the normal number of receptors needed to remove cholesterol from the blood.
