

Noah wins 1st round at WCT finals

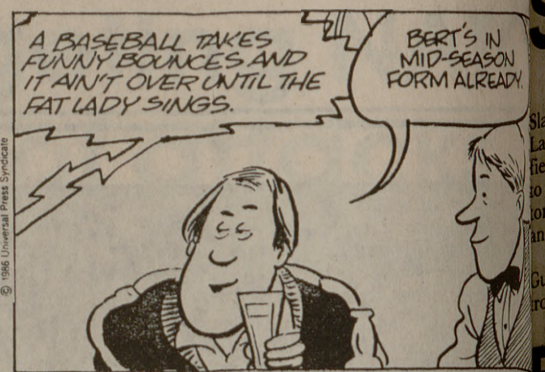
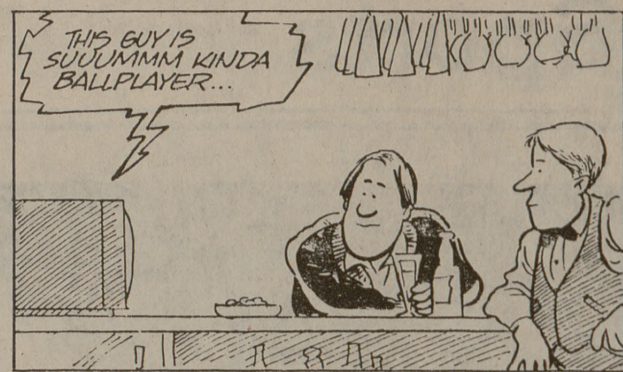
DALLAS (AP) — Frenchman Yannick Noah made the big shots at the right time Tuesday night to defeat Matt Anger in the first round of the World Championship Tennis finals at Reunion Arena, 7-5, 6-4, 6-2.
 Johan Kriek won the other first-round match by beating Brad Gilbert 6-4, 6-1, 2-6, 4-6, 6-3.
 Noah, ranked eighth in the world, broke Anger's service just four times in the entire match, but the breaks came at crucial times.
 He broke him at 6-5 of the first set by making a diving, tumbling backhand return of Anger's attempt at a passing shot. That set up the break-point, which Noah made with a drop shot that the lunging Anger could not return.
 In the final set, Noah got a break at 2-1 on two outstanding passing shots. The first was a twisting overhead that landed in a corner behind the outstretched racket of the 6-foot-2 Anger. Noah also got a second break at 5-2, the final shot hitting Anger at the net.
 Both Noah and Anger, ranked 25th in the world, were making their first appearance in the WCT finals.
 Noah now meets third-seeded Stefan Edberg of Sweden in a quarterfinal match Thursday.
 Kriek, making his third appearance in the WCT finals, was trailing Gilbert 2-0 in the fifth set when he changed his style of play and started his winning rally.
 Kriek, ranked 14th in the world, broke 11th-ranked Gilbert twice to take a 4-2 lead. Gilbert broke Kriek to pull within 4-3. But Kriek broke back and held on to win and advance to the quarterfinals against top-seeded Mats Wilander Wednesday night.

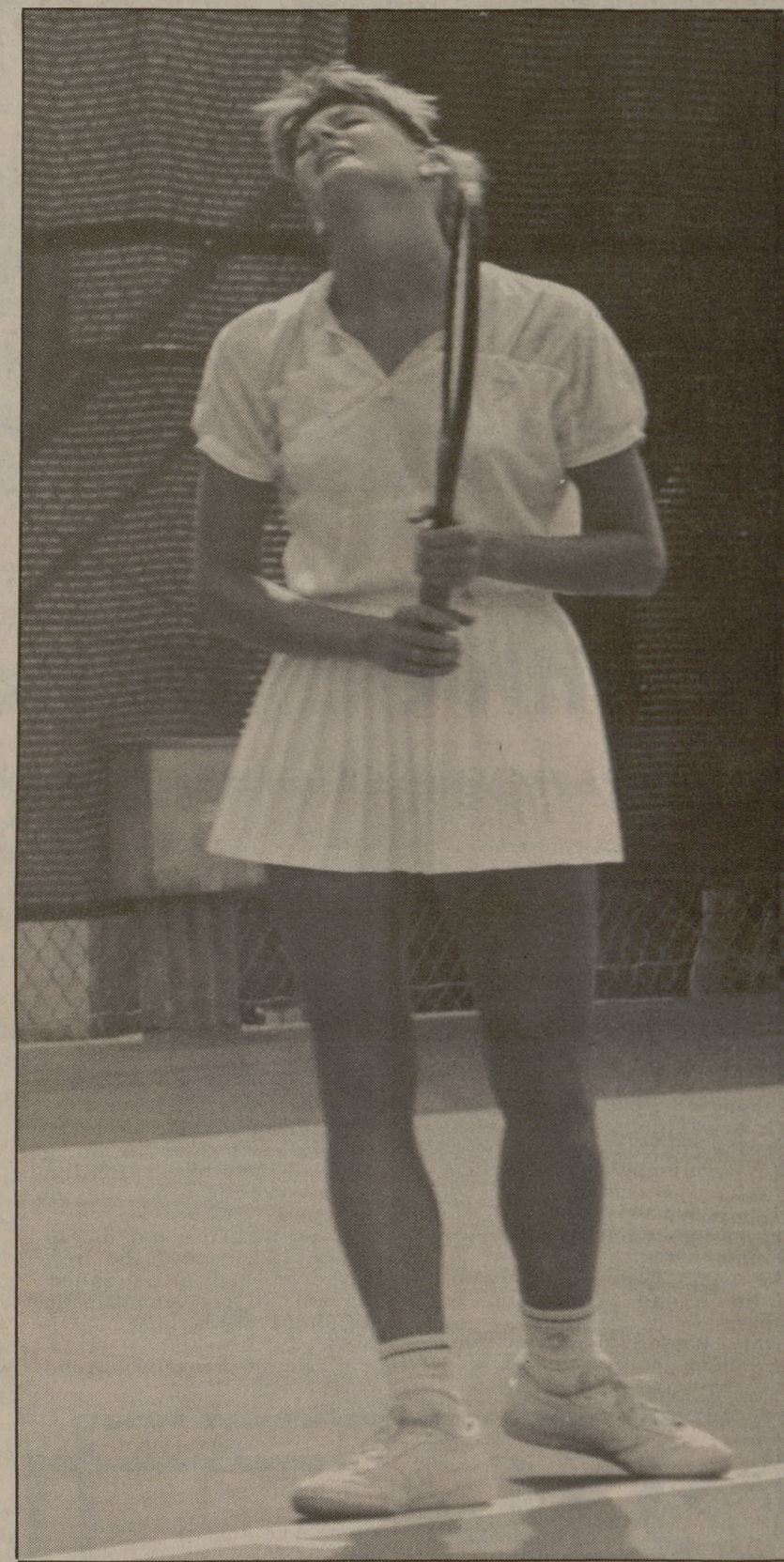

Texas A&M Women's Coach Bobby Kleinecke said he was short by four roses.
 Seniors Vanne Akagi and Christiaanese each received a rose from Kleinecke before their dual match against SMU since it was their final home appearance.
 And those two were the only players to win singles matches as the Mustangs handed the 18th-ranked Aggies a 6-3 loss at Omar Smith Tennis Center.
 The loss drops A&M to 4-4 Southwest Conference action, No. 22 SMU remains undefeated 6-0. But more importantly, in SMU a six-match cushion in SWC race, which is determining the number of matches won.
 "This (loss) won't kill us," Kleinecke said. "But it hurts us to get to two back."
 The two seniors looked like they would set the tone for the matches as they posted the first of the dual match with straight victories.
 Akagi played impressive tennis the No. 1 spot as she beat Jean Sterling 6-2, 6-3.
 "I think it's the best match played in a long time," Akagi said. "My coach from home (in Waialua, Hawaii) called me just before for the courts. He really inspired today."
 Christiaanese also was happy to play her 6-3, 6-4 win over Tammy O'tensen, but disappointed with team loss.
 "They (SMU) weren't as tough as some of the teams we've played," Christiaanese said. "They're scrappy but I think we could have beat them."
 However, missed opportunities dug the team into a hole during the play.
 A&M's No. 2 singles player, Labuschagne dropped a disappointing 6-1, 3-6, 6-4 match to Heather Hairston. Labuschagne had a lead in the final set before Hairston rallied to win.
 Aggies Gaye Lynne Gensler and Laura Liong, in their first action of the week, both developed leg cramps the late goings of their matches. The cramps came at a particularly bad time for Gensler as she was battling Lynda Tate in a third set. Tate won 6-7, 6-2, 7-4.
 The cramps kept both Gensler and Liong out of the Nos. 1 and 2 doubles matches with usual partners Akagi and Christiaanese. Only No. 2 tandem of Labuschagne and Karen Marshall posted a dual win, beating Sterling and O'tensen 6-2, 6-4.
