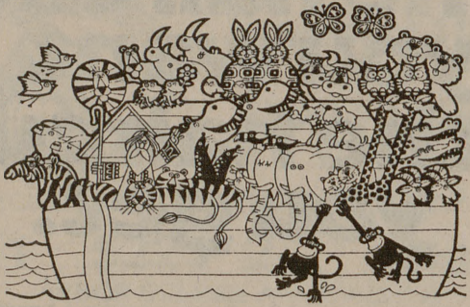

Whalers, Leafs upsetting NHL playoff picture

(AP) — For the second straight night, the Hartford Whalers shocked the Quebec Nordiques and the lowly Toronto Maple Leafs upset the Chicago Blackhawks Thursday night in the NHL playoffs and took commanding leads in their first-round series.

In winning 4-1 over the highly-favored Nordiques, winners of the regular-season Adams championship with the fourth-best record in the NHL, the fourth-place Whalers went back to Hartford for Games 3 and 4 on Saturday and Sunday with a 2-0 advantage in their best-of-five series.

The Maple Leafs, meanwhile, defeated the Black Hawks 6-4 to go up 2-0 in their Norris Division series despite four goals by Denis Savard. The Maple Leafs had the worst record of the 16 Stanley Cup playoff teams and the 19th worst record in the league overall during the regular season.

Otherwise, things went according to form in Thursday night's playoff action, as Montreal beat Boston 3-2 in the Adams Division, Philadelphia nipped the New York Rangers 2-1 and Washington stopped the New York Islanders 5-2 in the Patrick and Minnesota beat St. Louis 6-2 in the Norris.

In late action, Edmonton defeated Vancouver 5-1 and Calgary downed Winnipeg 6-4 in the Smythe Division. The Oilers and Jets both take 2-0 leads in their series.

Whalers 4, Nordiques 2

Paul MacDermid scored two goals and Mike Liut turned in his second consecutive strong performance in goal to lead the Whalers over the Nordiques. Stewart Gavin and Torrie Robertson also scored for the underdog Whalers.

Canadiens 3, Bruins 2

Claude Lemieux's second power-play goal of the game, with 2:27 left in the third period, led Montreal over Boston. The victory gave the Canadiens a 2-0 advantage over the Bruins as the series headed back to Boston.

Flyers 2, Rangers 1

Rich Sutter and Brad McCrimmon scored 11 seconds apart in the first period to trigger the Flyers over the Rangers.

The Patrick Division champion Flyers showed why they were the top defensive team in the league, holding New York to 12 shots.

Capitals 5, Islanders 2

Defenseman Scott Stevens had one goal and two assists and Bob Gould scored twice to lead Washington past the Islanders for the second straight night.

After assisting on Washington's first two goals, Stevens snapped a 2-2 tie with a blue line slapshot at 18:35 of the second period.

North Stars 6, Blues 2

Dennis Maruk recorded two goals and two assists and Brian Bellows added two goals, leading the North Stars over the Blues to even their series at 1-1.

The wide-open game bore little resemblance to Wednesday night's contest, which the Blues won 2-1.

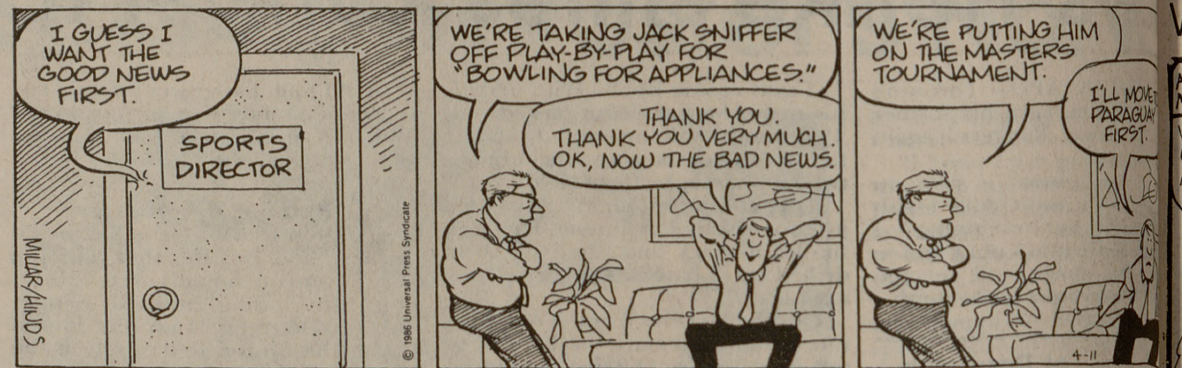
Maple Leafs 6, Blackhawks 4

Astros blank Giants to get 1st win

HOUSTON (AP) — It took smooth left-hander Bob Knepper to get the Houston Astros back into their successful routine against the San Francisco Giants Thursday night.

Knepper, who has won seven of his last eight decisions over his former team, blanked San Francisco 4-0 on five hits, preventing the Giants from sweeping the three-game series. The Giants have won only three of their last 16 games in the Astrodome.

Knepper outpitched San Francisco starter Vida Blue, who was trying to win his 200th career game.

"He had great command of his pitches, he was in and out all night long," Giants Manager Roger Craig said. "He pitched a masterpiece tonight."

"Vida had his good fastball and he pitched well enough to win but he got outpitched. He started getting the ball up a little but we didn't score any runs, so it didn't matter anyway."

Knepper said his complete game was an extension of his spring training.

"I felt good all spring," Knepper said. "I worked on rhythm, tempo and my delivery. I thought I left spring training with the most I've ever accomplished."

The Astros dropped the first two games of the season, the first for new Manager Hal Lanier.

"You can forget those first two games and you can forget tonight too, we've got a lot more games to play," Lanier said.

Blue gave up only four hits before leaving the game in the sixth inning.

"I pitched well but it's frustrating to pitch well and have the opposing pitcher pitch just as well," Blue said. "My control in the key part of the game was a concern. I'm a power pitcher and I have to throw hard all the time."

Kevin Bass and Glenn Davis had run-scoring singles for the Astros.

Knepper, 1-0, extended his Astrodome string of innings without issuing a walk to 30; he finished last season with 21 consecutive walkless innings at home. Knepper, 15-13 last season, struck out five.

Houston's Phil Garner doubled to right field in the fourth inning and scored on Bass' single to left.

Billy Hatcher reached base in the sixth inning with a bunt single. He stole second and went to third on the

same play on catcher Bob Brenly's throwing error.

Hatcher then raced home on a wild pitch by Blue. Blue struck out five and walked two in 5 1/3 innings.

In the Houston eighth, Bill Doran walked, second and Garner also walked off reliever Jeff Son. Doran went to third on a wild pitch and Blue

gled him in.

Garner was thrown out at the plate on the shortstop Brad Wellman before Dickie Thompson in another run with his 500th major league hit.

Brenly was the only Giant to reach third base. Knepper, He singled in the second inning and

threw on Rob Thompson's double to left.

Brenly singled again in the fifth but he was out by catcher Mark Bailey trying to steal second

Cardinals 4, Cubs 2

ST. LOUIS (AP) — Ozzie Smith singled his way to break a fourth-inning tie and Rick O'Connell earned his first major-league win in almost three years leading the St. Louis Cardinals to a 4-2 victory Monday over the Chicago Cubs.

Owens struck out two and walked four before the game two batters into the seventh inning. Worrell saved Owens' first victory in a St. Louis form.

Smith's hit was one of four St. Louis singles in the game. Jack Clark opened the fourth against Cubs' pitcher Ekersley with a single to left and Andy Van Slyke walked. After Terry Pendleton sacrificed and Heath was hit by a pitch, Smith broke a 1-1 tie with a hit into center field.

Expos 6, Braves 3
