

Reserves power Braves to 8-7 victory over Astros

HOUSTON (AP) — In his first season as manager of the Atlanta Braves, Chuck Tanner is keeping his promise to his reserves.

"He told us at the beginning of the season he was going to play everyone," veteran Chris Chambliss said Sunday after the Braves held on to defeat the Houston Astros 8-7.

Reserves Chambliss, Ted Simmons and Billy Sample accounted for eight of the Braves' 13 hits and scored six runs. Sample's controversial three-run homer off loser Mike Scott, 0-2, in the fourth was the key blow.

Sample's fourth-inning shot, which gave the Braves a 4-0 lead, was ruled fair by third-base umpire John McSherry, triggering a heated dispute with Houston Manager Hal Lanier.

"I hit it hard enough to be a home run. I just stood there and waited to see if it was fair," said Sample, who collected his first three National League hits.

"When we play another group of guys it doesn't hurt at all," Tanner said. "It just gives our regulars a chance to sit and watch and rest."

The Atlanta bench had help from Ken Oberkfell, a regular, who drove in four runs, and veteran pitcher Gene Garber, who pitched out of a ninth-inning jam after the Astros jumped on relief ace Bruce Sutter.

Atlanta took a 1-0 lead in the second inning when Simmons singled, stole second, went to third on a fly ball and scored on Oberkfell's single.

The Braves increased their lead to 5-0 in the fourth on Sample's homer which followed singles by Simmons and Chambliss. Oberkfell then reached on a fielding error by Houston shortstop Dickie Thon, was sacrificed to second and scored when second baseman Bill Doran mishandled Omar Moreno's grounder.

The Astros scored their first run in the fourth when Thon singled, Denny Walling walked, Thon took third on a fly ball and scored on a passed ball by Simmons.

Oberkfell drove in Atlanta's last three runs with a sacrifice fly in the sixth inning and singles in the seventh and ninth. The last one proved decisive when

Houston scored twice in the bottom of the ninth on a walk and doubles by Doran and Phil Garner.

Jim Pankovits then greeted Garber with a single, but with runners at first and third, Glenn Davis grounded into a game-ending double play.

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Darren Daulton cracked a two-run homer, and Gary Redus hit a solo shot to back Shane Rawley's 10-hit pitching as the Philadelphia Phillies defeated the New York Mets 4-2 Sunday.

Expos 3, Cardinals 2

ST. LOUIS (AP) — Mitch Webster and Herm Winningham hit solo home runs and Bryn Smith scattered three hits in six innings, leading the Montreal Expos to a 3-2 triumph Sunday that halted the previously undefeated St. Louis Cardinals' winning streak at four games.

Padres 7, Reds 6

SAN DIEGO (AP) — Marvell Wynne hit his second home run of the game Sunday to give the San Diego Padres a 7-6 victory over the Cincinnati Reds.

Wynne, who homered as a pinch hitter to lead off the seventh inning, hit a 2-1 pitch from Joe Price over the right-field wall in the ninth.

Dodgers 3, Giants 2

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Franklin Stubbs hit a tie-breaking two-run homer in the seventh inning Sunday, his third home run in as many games, and Orel Hershey scattered seven hits, leading the Los Angeles Dodgers to a 3-2 victory over the San Francisco Giants.

Orioles squeeze by Rangers, 3-2

ARLINGTON (AP) — Cal Ripken hit a two-run single in the eighth inning to catapult the Baltimore Orioles to 3-2 victory over the Texas Rangers Sunday.

Scott McGregor scattered eight hits, struck out two and did not allow a walk in 7 2/3 innings and Don Aase picked up the save.

Alan Wiggins drew a one-out walk from rookie Jose Guzman, 1-1, in the eighth.

Lacy singled him to third, Lacy stole second, then Ripken blooped a single down the right field line to score Wiggins and Lacy. The throw from right field beat Lacy to the plate, but he kicked the ball out of catcher Don Slaught's glove.

The Rangers got a run in the second inning when Larry Parrish, Slaught and Curtis Wilkerson singled and added a run in the sixth when Pete O'Brien doubled and Gary Ward singled.

Baltimore got an unearned run in the seventh. Eddie Murray led off with a grounder to first that went between O'Brien's legs for an error, his first in 70 games. Fred Lynn singled to left, sending Murray to third, and he came home on Jim Dwyer's grounder to first.

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — Danny Tartabull snapped an eighth-inning tie with a two-run homer, his third extra-base hit of the game, to lift the

Mike Moore, 1-0, limited the Twins to four hits over the final eight innings, finishing with a six-hitter, five strikeouts and one walk. Mike Smithson, 1-1, went the distance for the Twins and took the loss despite tying his career high with nine strikeouts.

NEW YORK (AP) — Ron Guidry won his second start of 1986, aided by a two-run single from Don Mattingly, as the New York Yankees ended their season-opening home-stand Sunday with a 3-2 victory over the Milwaukee Brewers.

It gave the Yankees a three-game sweep over Milwaukee, four consecutive victories and a 5-1 record, equalling their best start in 11 seasons.

CLEVELAND (AP) — Scott Bailes picked up his first major-league victory with 5 1/3 scoreless innings of two-hit relief and Andre Thornton's homer highlighted a five-run first inning as the Cleveland Indians battered Detroit pitching for 19 hits and beat the Tigers 8-2 Sunday.

Alan Trammell drove home Darrell Evans with both Detroit runs. Evans led off the Tigers' second and fourth innings with singles and scored on Trammell's single the first time and his double the next time.

Royals 7, Blue Jays 4

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — Frank White and Hal McRae jumped on relief pitcher Dennis Lamp with run-scoring singles in the fifth inning Sunday that carried the Kansas City Royals to a 7-4 victory over the Toronto Blue Jays.

Willie Wilson and George Brett hit consecutive home runs in the third inning and Steve Balboni homered in the fourth, all of them off Dave Stieb and all with the bases empty.

Bud Black, 1-1, got the victory with help from Steve Farr.

Red Sox 12, White Sox 2

CHICAGO (AP) — Wade Boggs hit three singles and drove in four runs as the Boston Red Sox pounded 16 hits and buried the Chicago White Sox 12-2 Sunday.

Jim Rice added three runs batted in, two on a home run, and Bill Buckner and Dwight Evans each had two RBI. Boston starter Tim Lollar allowed two hits and one run in six innings.

A's 11, Angels 7

OAKLAND, Calif. (AP) — Rookie Jose Canseco drove in five runs with a single and his second home run as the A's beat the California Angels 11-7 Sunday.

Canseco, a 21-year-old outfielder who hit 36 homers in the minor leagues last season, hit a three-run homer in the fifth inning and had a two-run single in the sixth.

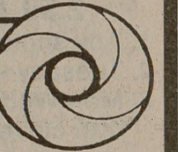
