Sample's fourth-inning shot, which gave the Braves 4-0 lead, was ruled fair by third-base umpire John AcSherry, triggering a heated dispute with Houston Manager Hal Lanier.

'I hit it hard enough to be a home run. I just stood here and waited to see if it was fair," said Sample, who ollected his first three National League hits.

"When we play another group of guys it doesn't nurt at all," Tanner said. "It just gives our regulars a hance to sit and watch and rest.'


