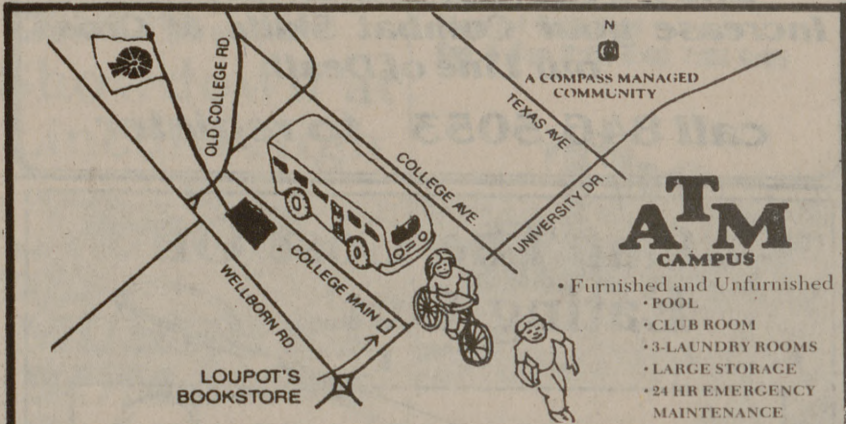

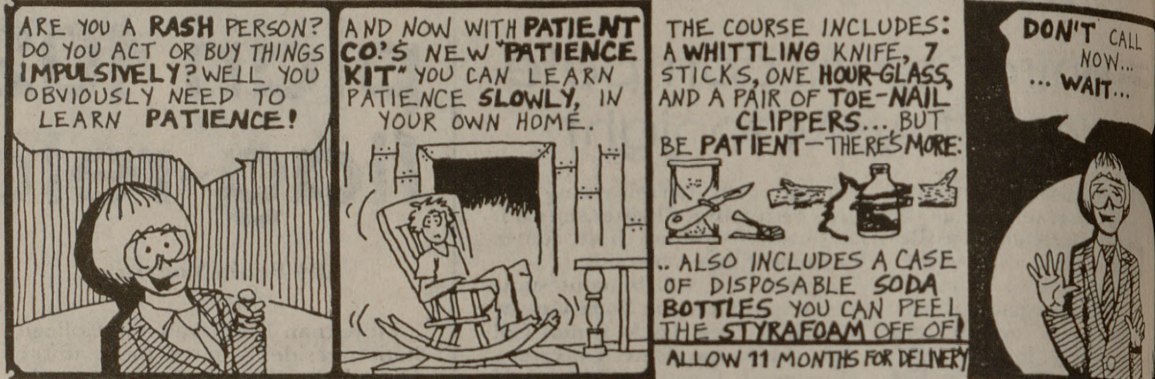

with the agreement, which could be signed as early as June 6 — if all sides agreed.

Nicaraguan President Daniel Ortega said on April 13 the Nicaraguans would sign an agreement on June 6 if the administration agreed to terminate Contra aid.

It was not known whether he was responding to the Habib letter, but Slatery said it nevertheless provided

another key element for a compromise.

Rep. Jim Leach, R-Iowa, like Slatery an opponent of Contra aid, called the letter "extraordinary" and "a very profound basis for reconciliation." He said he is not certain that other officials in the administration support Habib's views, however.

Informed aides to several lawmakers, including a key Senate Republican who supported Contra aid in the Senate, speculated that ad-

ministration officials are coming the view of many lawmakers the 5-year-old Contra effort work and that Habib could play a role in convincing Reagan to

Moreover, despite repeated attempts, Reagan still has been unable to get Congress to approve a restricted military aid. And polls of the American people still show U.S. aid to the Contras by nearly to-1 margin.

in the same quarter in 1985, officials said.

Pennzoil officials attributed the drop mostly to the slump in oil prices.

Richard J. Howe, Pennzoil president, predicted that average oil and gas prices will be even lower during the second quarter.

Earnings per common share were 93 cents for the year's first quarter, compared to \$1.20 for the 1985 first quarter, Howe said. Operating income was \$112.6 million, compared to \$139.8 posted for the first quarter in 1985.

"However, last year's first quarter earnings included a gain of 21 cents per share from the sale of securities, so our operating results were relatively close to last year's," Howe said.

Howe said Pennzoil officials believe world prices on crude oil will approach \$20-a-barrel later this year.

"We expect natural gas prices, on the other hand, to weaken even further this summer due to various market and governmental forces, coupled with the normal summer-time slump in demand," he said.

In discussing the Texaco-Pennzoil case, Liedtke accused Texaco of unleashing a media blitz consisting of "half-truths, innuendos and, in some cases, extremely insulting and abusive charges."

In November, a jury ruled Texaco wrongfully interfered in a merger agreement between Pennzoil and Getty Oil Co. when it acquired Getty.

About one month ago, representatives of both companies met in

New York to discuss the possibility of settling the case, but Liedtke said Texaco offered nothing substantial during the meeting.

"In our opinion, Texaco has added no real meat to the Getty case," said Liedtke, who added his proposal would be reviewed by Pennzoil's board Thursday. "It was the same picked-over old bones."

On Wednesday, Texaco attorneys in a Houston state court asking that the award given to Pennzoil be overturned.

Liedtke said he had not seen briefs but understood from lawyers that they contained nothing new. He also said he knows of no further contact made between the two companies since the New York meeting and no plans for future meetings.

for academic freedom, responsibility and tenure, to be utilized by the various state universities and colleges as they chose. The A&M System adopted this overall policy verbatim, but the University chose to adopt a variation of it.

"Making sense out of the different policies is not always simple," Phillips said. "It's like a cross-walk between one and the other."

"It's a very complicated thing that borders on being a morass."

Phillips said when the University wants to change something, it must be sure to be consistent with the system, and that's why negotiations with an attorney are necessary.

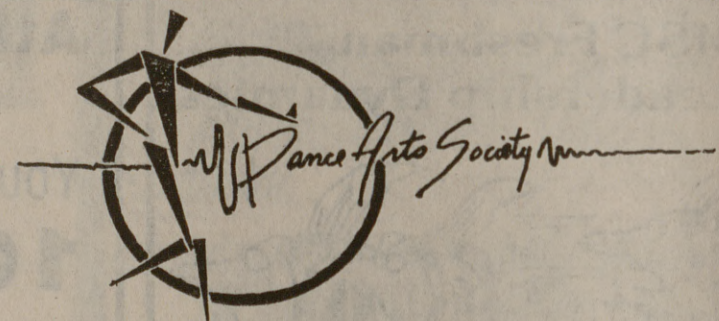
"What we are proposing is to take the various documents and blend them so that faculty and administrators will have just one cohesive, coherent document," Phillips said. "What we're doing is mostly procedural."

The senate is trying to account for the vast differences that occur from

college to college, which makes evaluation a difficult task, Phillips said.

"What they've tried to do is to get out in more detail what should be expected of a person seeking promotion," he said. "The situation is going to get better simply must increase our standards."
