AUSTIN - Anyone who has ever dropped jewelry down the drain and it vanish forever, knows how No. 9 Texas A&M feels now after it saw its chances of winning the Southwest Conference baseball title washed away by No. 5 Texas over the weekend

UT came into the three-game se-
