HOUSTON (AP) — Former Gov. Bill Clements leads the Republican gubernatorial race and will win the GOP primary Saturday without a runoff unless there is an unexpected increase of non-traditional GOP voters, according to the latest Houston Chronicle-KTRK-TV poll.

Among traditional primary voters, Clements has pulled ahead further in recent weeks, the poll said. His opponents, Rep. Tom Loeffler of Hunt and former Rep. Kent Hance of Lubbock, have gained no ground, according to the follow-up survey of likely GOP primary voters conducted. Surday through Tues conducted Sunday through Tues-

Clements has 62 percent of the support of those surveyed, Loeffler 16 percent and Hance 15 percent, with 7 percent undecided, the survey released Wednesday night
