## UT gets \$10 million donation

AUSTIN (AP) — Dallas businessman Robert Dedman, saying "you can't take it with you," joined his wife Thursday in pledging \$10 million for undergraduate scholarships at the University of Texas at Austin.

In announcing the gift, Dedman, founder and chairman of the board of Club Corporation of America, made a pitch for other wealthy Texans to "enjoy the thrill of giving while living."

The Dedman's gift of \$1 million a year for 10 years, starting in 1986, is the largest scholarship gift ever received by UT-Austin and is the largest single donation to UT's College of Liberal Arts.

In 1981, Dedman and his wife

Nancy, gave \$25 million to Southern Methodist University in Dallas, saying then that private institutions needed the money more than tax-supported schools.

Dedman, who has three degrees from UT and a master's of law degree from SMU, told UT officials and supporters Thursday, "I've said many times that I think SMU is the best asset Dallas has. I think the University of Texas is the best asset of the state of Texas has."

The \$10 million pledge will almost double UT-Austin's endowment for student scholarships, which is now nearly \$13.9 million, and would allow certain students — selected by a committee — to receive a

minimum of \$24,000 for four years.

Other "Dedman scholars" receive scholarships ranging from minimums of \$750 to \$2,000.

"I'm visiting with you just bit here to get some of the other fortunes in the state to begin start turning loose of a bit," said Dedman, who Forbes magazine says has assets of at least \$1 billion.

"One obviously other big to give is the simple realization they don't put any luggage on hearses — you can't take it with you, so you probably ought to start something about thinking about it away," he said.

## 'Skip day' causes teacher's reassignment

AUSTIN (AP) — The 175 McCallum High School seniors who took an unauthorized "skip day" last week won't be disciplined, but an award-winning teacher who took part isn't so lucky, school officials said.

Science teacher Deron Bissett, who was named the outstanding high school science teacher in 1982 by the Science Teachers of Texas, has been reassigned to the school district's learning resource center.

Last April, the Austin school board voted to eliminate a long-time district tradition of giving high

school seniors three days off for various activities. They said the action was necessary because of education reform laws that require students to be in school 175 days a year.

A large number of McCallum's 300-plus seniors went to a picnic at nearby Wimberley last Friday. One student who declined to give her name said Bissett was a "chaperone."

Some seniors returned to school with signed excuses Monday, but about 175 were marked absent.

Bissett confirmed his reassignment but would not give specific reasons for the transfer.

"I am still a teacher in the Independent School District, am attempting to make sure rights are not violated," Bissett said. "I intend to get back in the room and the sooner the better, the kids' sake." McCallum Principal Billy Smoot said he was not surprised at the seniors' actions.

"Senioritis started here early year," Smoot said. "By January, February, I knew the sap was coming to rise because the seniors were getting restless."
