UT gets \$10 million donation

AUSTIN (AP) - Dallas businessman Robert Dedman, saying "you can't take it with you," joined his wife Thursday in pledging \$10 million for undergraduate scholarships at the University of Texas at Austin.

In announcing the gift, Dedman, founder and chairman of the board of Club Corporation of America, made a pitch for other wealthy Tex-'enjoy the thrill of giving while living. The Dedman's gift of \$1 million a

year for 10 years, starting in 1986, is the largest scholarship gift ever re-ceived by UT-Austin and is the largest single donation to UT's College

Nancy, gave \$25 million to Southern Methodist University in Dallas, saying then that private institutions needed the money more than tax-

Dedman, who has three degrees from UT and a master's of law degree from SMU, told UT officials and supporters Thursday, "I've said many times that I think SMU is the best asset Dallas has. I think the University of Texas is the best asset the
