NBA Playoffs

Rockets nab series in double

DENVER (AP) — Lewis Lloyd and Rodney McCray hit key jumpers in the final 1:45 of a second overtime period Thursday night as the Houston Rockets, despite losing three starters to fouls, outlasted the Denver Nuggets 126-122 and clinched the NBA playoff series.

The Rockets, defeating Denver 4-2 in the best-of-seven series, advanced to the Western Conference finals against the Los Angeles Lakers. The Lakers, the defending NBA champions, earlier wrapped up their second-round series with a 120-107 victory over Dallas.

Lloyd's 18-footer, just beating the 24-second shot clock, with 1:45 left gave Houston a 124-121 lead. McCray sank a 17-footer along the baseline with 55 seconds remaining, and Denver couldn't counter.

The Rockets were without Twin Towers Akeem Olajuwon and Ralph Sampson and point guard Robert Reid in the end.

Houston, trailing by as many as 12 points, sent the game into overtime on the play of Olajuwon and Jim Peterson. Olajuwon scored 12 points in the final quarter before drawing a double technical foul and being ejected. His replacement, Peterson, scored seven straight points to put Houston ahead 100-95 with 4:48 left.

But Calvin Natt's three-point play produced a 104-104 tie with 1:49 remaining, and the teams then traded buckets, with Sampson's dunk accounting for a 108-108 tie at the end of regulation.

Peterson got a quick basket to start the overtime, but he drew his sixth foul moments later. Samp-

son followed suit with 1:40 left in overtime. Natt scored on that play but missed the free throw, leaving the score tied at 114-114.

Natt's inside move put Denver up 116-114, but Mitchell Wiggins countered for Houston on a baseline drive with 37 seconds remaining. He was fouled on the play, but missed the free throw. Both teams missed subsequent shots to force the second overtime.

Olajuwon finished with 28 points to pace Houston. Lloyd had 25 and McCray 20. Alex English had 42 points for Denver, followed by Natt with 23.

With English scoring 17 points in the first quarter, the Nuggets jumped out to a 12-point lead. Houston got within seven points early in the second quarter, but Denver's back-up center, Danny

Schayes, got 10 points in the first half, hit only one shot from the floor, made 13 foul shots, were named by the shorter Nugget, committed 10 turnovers and six.

Houston ran off 11 points early in the third quarter, to draw into a 68-74 lead. Lloyd had 14 points in the quarter, but the Nugget shooting produced a 77 lead heading into the period.

'Kareem' of the crop ousts Maverick

DALLAS (AP) — The aroused Los Angeles Lakers charged into the NBA Western Conference finals with a 120-107 victory over the upstart Dallas Mavericks behind Kareem Abdul-Jabbar's 27 points and Earvin Johnson's clutch fourth-quarter play.

The Lakers, the defending world champions, took the bitter best-of-seven series from the fiery and talkative Mavericks 4-2. The Lakers now face the Houston Rockets who beat the Denver

Nuggets 126-122 to clinch their series.

The Lakers built a 75-53 lead early in the third period, but then had to beat back a Maverick rally that narrowed the deficit to 91-89 early in the fourth period.

Mark Aguirre, who injured an ankle and missed most of the fourth period, had 14 of his 28 points in the third period.

Dallas' Rolando Blackman scored 12 straight points at the start of the fourth period, but James Worthy and Johnson got

the Laker offense in gear. Blackman finished with 23.

Worthy had 21 points and Johnson added 23, including 13 in the fourth period. Johnson made nine free throws in the quarter.

The Lakers were called "clowns" by Dallas General Manager Norm Sonju before the game, but the intense defending champions took control from the start.

Abdul-Jabbar scored the last three baskets of the first half on a dunk, a skyhook, and a 20-foot set

shot to hand the Lakers a 69-51 halftime lead over shooting Mavericks.

OAKLAND (AP) — Dave Kingman and Tony Phillips each singled to drive in a run in the eighth inning Thursday to break up a scoreless pitching duel and lead the Oakland A's to a 2-1 victory over the Milwaukee Brewers.

Left-hander Ted Higuera, 4-2, had blanked Oakland on four hits while striking out eight through seven innings, but ran into trouble after Alfredo Griffin led off the eighth with a single.

Griffin took second on Mickey Tottleton's sacrifice and scored on Phillip's single to left. Phillips, who took second on the throw home, advanced to third on a fielder's choice and scored on Kingman's single to center.

Chris Codiroli, 3-3, was the winner, allowing eight hits in eight innings. Steve Outiveros lost the shutout, allowing Randy Ready's first home run

of the year in the ninth, but still earned his third save of the season.

Milwaukee, which stranded 11 runners, left the bases loaded in the fifth and Oakland failed to score after loading the bases in their half of the inning.

In a controversial play that led to the ejection of A's Manager Jackie Moore, Carney Lansford was tagged out by Brewers' catcher Charlie Moore on an attempted steal of home with two out to end the Oakland threat in the bottom of the fifth.

Lansford slid across the plate after Tony Phillips squared around to bunt, but umpire Ted Hendry called Lansford out on a tag after the pitch. Moore argued for several minutes before being ejected by Hendry.
