A&M grabs berth in World Series

The No. 5 A&M softball team battled the weather and the No. 6 Kansas Jayhawks this past weekend and the result is a trip to the Softball College World Series in Omaha, Neb.

A&M, 38-11 and representing the Central Region, will face Creighton, 35-20, of the Midwest Region in the first round of the double-elimination tournament Thursday at 7:30 p.m.

Creighton advanced to the Series after Nebraska was disqualified for using ineligible players.

"I can't think of anybody better to open the College World Series with," A&M Coach Bob Brock said, "than the home team (Creighton)."

"The fans will be treated to a good game. There's a lot of talent on both sides."

The Aggies gained entry to the Series when they defeated the Jayhawks at A&M's Penberthy Field two games to none on the talented arm of junior pitcher Shawn Andaya. Andaya held Kansas to three hits, while striking out 12 and allowing no walks in Friday's series-opening 1-0 win.

Andaya also provided the Aggies' offensive firepower in the game with two hits, and scored the winning run as left fielder Cindy Foster singled her home after doubling with two outs.

The thunderstorms which fell on the Bryan-College Station area Saturday forced postponement of game two and three (if Kansas won the second game) to Sunday.

Brock chose to start Andaya instead of freshman Julie Carpenter for Sunday's game in the hope of keeping the series from having to go three games.

"It was awful hard to make that decision," Brock said. "I opted for the experience, not necessarily the physical aspect, because Karen is a real good pitcher too."

And Andaya's mound experience paid off for the Aggies as she struck out Kansas' Gayle Luedke with a runner on third and forced a ground out to end the game and give A&M a 1-0 10-inning victory.

Andaya and Kansas starter Tracy Bunge only allowed two hits apiece and it was a sacrifice fly with gave A&M the victory.

A&M, playing as the visitors, put Carrie Heightly on second in the top of the 10th, as per the International Tie-Breaker rule. Andaya sacrifice bunted to move Heightly to third and then shortstop Liz Mizera

slammed a sacrifice fly to the fence to score Heightly.

"Liz had been playing well all year," Brock said. "And Kansas kept pitching to her. A lot of teams walk her. Had the wind not been blowing

in, it would have been a 2-0 game."

Brock also said the team's attitude is right for the tournament.

"We look at this as the third season," Brock said. "First there was the regular season, then this regional se-

ries, and now the College World Series."

So we're going to play a fresh start. When I told them we'd be playing Creighton, they were much more fired up."

Martin said he did not want the

series to go three games, but he knew his teammates could come back.

"I was scared," Martin said. "I really didn't want to play tonight. I kinda had a feeling we would come back. I didn't know when it was going to be, but I had a feeling because we've done it all year long."

Magallanes said early in the seventh, he knew A&M would fight back.

"I've never had that good of an offensive series before," Magallanes said. "I was seeing the ball well. We knew we had to battle. I think when we got our third or fourth run, our

momentum just shifted and we'd tie, at least."

Johnson said the tough who really was the best team in Texas and Arkansas did less.

"I don't think this tournament is slighted because two teams were playing. That trophy is a bit. I think we're the best ballclub in this particular tournament, this particular week."

"I'm proud of our guys. I think we would have won the way."
