## Texas GOP plans for possible fight for House speaker spot

AUSTIN (AP) — Senior Republican members of the Texas House have been invited to a private meeting Friday to discuss with the GOP might back should a race develop for speaker of the House, the *Austin American-Statesman* reported Wednesday.

GOP house members who are in at least their third two-year term were invited to the session. The *American-Statesman* said the session will be held in conjunction with this weekend's GOP state convention.

The only person other than the 18 lawmakers who would attend, an invitation letter said, would be Republican Party Chairman George Strake of Houston.

Quoting the letter, the newspaper said the meeting's purpose is to discuss "whether the group wants a contingent Republican speaker candidate to secure contingent pledges of support which would activate only should a speaker's race develop."

House Speaker Gib Lewis, D-Fort Worth, is opposed by Republican developer K. Wayne Lee for re-election to his House seat.

## Mexico finishes debt relief plan

MEXICO CITY (AP) — Mexican officials have drawn up a new plan for gaining a multi-billion dollar rescue package from the international financial community and will likely carry it to Washington by Thursday.

Treasury Secretary Gustavo Petricoli, at a breakfast with foreign correspondents, said the plan would be presented to President Miguel de la Madrid and the economic Cabinet for approval.

He declined to reveal details of the plan but said it would reflect the fresh economic problems the nation has suffered because of the collapse of world oil prices.

"We will present what is the actual position of the Mexican economy, the real situation that confronts us," he said.

"It is practically impossible for the economy to be able to totally absorb the external impact, the shock in the balance of payments," he said.

Mexico, the world's fourth largest producer of crude, is expected to lose at least \$6 billion in foreign revenues from oil sales this year because of the drop in oil prices.

As a result, the government is strapped for cash to continue meeting payments on its foreign debt of \$97.6 billion.

Petricoli said the nation owes about \$1.5 billion in interest and principal payments by month's end, but he declined to say how much the nation still has in international reserves to pay the tab. Other analysts have said those reserves are running around \$5 billion.

## Police say cut in tickets is in protest

DALLAS (AP) — Some Dallas police officers are putting the brakes on traffic citations, saying they are reducing the number of tickets written in protest of the city's recent 1 percent paycut.

About 125 members of the Dallas Police Association voted Tuesday to declare the reduction in citations a deliberate action. The vote came after a three-hour, closed-door special general meeting at the organization's downtown offices.

According to figures released by police Tuesday, 28 percent fewer traffic citations were written the month after the City Council cut most municipal employees' pay by 1 percent.

Using that estimate, the city stands to lose more than \$3 million if the decline holds steady for the rest of the year. The city had projected it would save \$1.2 million as a result of the pay cut.

Tuesday's action was taken against the advice of association president J.K. Ramsey, who had said before the meeting that any reduction was due to stepped-up crime-fighting efforts.

Ramsey said Wednesday not all the association members were present at the meeting.

"There is a different line of thinking. Some of the officers do not like that (the slowdown)," he said.

Municipal court records reflect a citation decline of almost 45 percent. The court measures the number of citations according to their height in a stack, while police cull their figures from officers' activity reports.
