Louganis wins gold

HOUSTON (AP) — Though he wasn't at his faultless best, Greg Louganis had more than enough Thursday to earn three perfect 10s on his way to victory in the 3-meter plat-form diving competition at the U.S.

Olympic Festival. And in women's basketball, Ten-nessee sophomore Bridgette Gordon scored 22 points as the South downed the North 83-78 for its fifth consecutive gold medal. A&M sophomore Donna Roper added six points for the South, which compiled a 4-0 record.

Louganis, the double gold med-alist at the 1984 Olympics earned his 39th national title and a trip to the World Championships in Spain next month, where he is the defending champion.

Louganis, 26, of Boca Raton, Fla., now has nine Festival gold medals. Michelle Mitchell, 24, of Scottsdale, Ariz., had to go to the last dive to the way.

A&M signees lead South to All-Star win

HOUSTON (AP) — Texas A&M signee Lance Pavlas of Tomball hit Houston Jones' Kerry Simien with a 2-yard touchdown pass with 3:55 left in the game to rally the South to a 17-13 victory over the North in the Texas High School Coaches Association All-Star football game Thursday night.

Pavlas, only the second quarterback in All-Star history to surpass 200 yards passing, set up the score with a 37-yard pass to future A&M teammate Percy Waddle of Colum-

Pavlas and Waddle's passing and the running of Hempstead's Harvey Williams propelled the South, which narrowed its series deficit to 28-20-4 Pavlas was named the game's outstanding offensive player and South defensive tackle Greg Oefinger of San Antonio Churchill won the defensive honor.

The touchdown nullified a record 81-yard punt return for a touch-down by the North's Johnny Hurn-don of Daingerfield that gave the North a 13-10 lead with 1:52 to play in the third quarter.

Hurndon's return broke the previous record return of 68 yards by Galena Park's Michael Frazier in 1971.

Pavlas completed 16 of 32 passes for 246 yards to break the previous record of 224 yards set by Robert Armstrong of Houston Sam Houston in 1971

Waddle caught seven passes for 173 yards, also an All-Star record, A&M student Melissa Dowling is breaking the only mark of 166 yards receiving by Bryan Willingham of Pasadena in 1971.
