



Patrol group not implicated in beating of illegal alien

PRESIDIO (AP) — No link has been found between a controversial paramilitary group and the reported assault of an undocumented alien by three heavily armed men dressed in military fatigues, authorities said.

Gary Brown, chief deputy with the Presidio County sheriff's office, said Tuesday that an investigation by his department did not produce any arrests at the time of the July 24 attack, which occurred near Presidio, located near the Mexican border. On July 30, Presidio County dep-

uties arrested three Odessa men near the border and charged them

with unlawfully carrying weapons. Hugh Rushton, chief U.S. Border

Texas man convicted in capital murder case

WACO (AP) — Testimony on whether Clifton Eugene Belyeu should get life in prison or the death penalty will continue today after a Waco jury spent less than an hour Wednesday convicting Belyeu of capital murder.

Belyeu, 27, of Cleburne was found guilty in the stabbing and shooting death of a West woman. The punishment phase of the trial

adjourned at 4 p.m. and will resume at 9 a.m. today. Belyeu was convicted of the Dec.

10, 1985, slaying of Melodie Bolton, the wife of a prominent Central Texas businessman.

Another Cleburne man, Earnest Ray Moore, 21, also is charged with the slaying. The two are being tried separately because Belyeu has a prior felony conviction while Moore does not. No trial date has been set

Ken Ables and Fred Horner, Belyeu's court-appointed attorneys, called two witnesses who testified for less than 30 minutes.

Defense witness Roger Smith, of the Dallas County Institute of Forensic Sciences, testified that he compared footprints found in Bolton's house in West with the soles of tennis shoes found in Belyeu's trailer Smith said he could not positively

identify the left tennis shoe as the shoe that made the footprint. Earlier in the trial, Dr. James

Ebert, a forensic photography expert from New Mexico, as a prosecution witness, testified that Belyeu's left tennis shoe made a muddy footprint in the Bolton home. He said he found three matching characteristics between the footprint and Belyeu's shoe. He said there was no likelihood any other shoe made the print.

Urgent search for fugitive inmate continues despite lack of leads

BRECKENRIDGE (AP) — The search for a fugitive death row inmate will continue, despite a lack of new leads to the escapee's wherea-bouts, authorities said Wednesday.

Richard Donald "Stony" Foster was believed to be hiding in the rugged terrain near Possum Kingdom Lake, officials said.

"We're not going to let him wait us out. . ." said Stephens County Sher-iff James Cain. "I personally think he's still in this area." Foster, 33, and another inmate es-

caped Sunday night from the Stephens County Jail. Texas Ranger Billy Peterson said, "We'll search 'til that sucker's

Palo Pinto County Sheriff John Turpin said there were no leads in

"Everything's the same," said Turpin. "We've got nothing. We'll just keep searching the same area.

Turpin said the escapee may have taken refuge in a house

The problem is that some people in the homes in the area are gone for a few days," he said. "Some are there only on weekends. We don't know."

Former lawyers for the Vietnam veteran have said Foster is suffering from war-related stress and will not

Fort Worth lawyer Jim Lane said, "I think I know where he is, at least in his own mind. He's back on the Mekong Delta in Vietnam."

Peterson called Lane's theory pure nonsense.

Inmate Cindy Davis, 27, who escaped with Foster, was captured Monday morning on the east side of Possum Kingdom Lake, about 25 miles northeast of Breckenridge.

At the time of the escape, Davis was being held on a charge of at-tempted capital murder for allegedly shooting at a police officer. Her parents said they believe Foster took

their daughter as a hostage. said that possibility is under inve

Foster had been convicted of mile der in November 1985 in Park County for the killing of a Sprin town man in April 1984. His exet tion date had not been set. He by been sent from death row to Bro enridge for a pretrial hearing of kidnapping charge.
