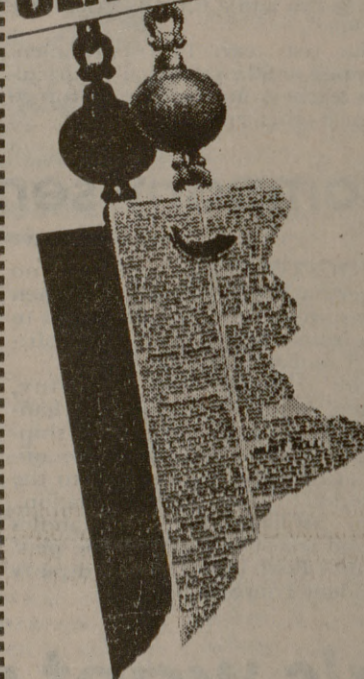

Gulf States Utilities cancels dividend asks for rate hike

AUSTIN (AP) — Gulf States Utilities, which canceled a stock dividend last week for the first time in three decades, must seek higher customer rates to weather a worsening financial crisis, GSU's president said Monday.

"We absolutely have to have increased revenues from the customers," GSU President E. Linn Draper said. "We can't go to Wall Street and borrow, even for the short term. It is a crisis situation."

GSU is seeking a rate increase in Louisiana, and a similar hike will be requested in Texas later this year, he said.

"If we don't get a large amount of increase in rates in the two jurisdictions, we will not have the cash that is required to continue to do business," Draper told a news conference. "It's a critical time in our corporate life. Our financial condition is plainly grave."

Draper said the company is suffering from the economic battering that has hit communities all along the Texas-Louisiana Gulf coast, where unemployment has soared as the petrochemical industry has declined.

He said GSU is doing "everything we can" to avoid bankruptcy.

"We think bankruptcy would be a disaster, not only for the owners of the company but for the region in general," he said. "I think the bankruptcy of a major utility like ours would have repercussions that would further damage an already fragile economy along the Texas-Louisiana Gulf Coast."

Before last week's decision by the company's board, Gulf States had paid dividends since 1947, Draper said.

Despite that cancellation, however, Gulf States' anticipated income next year will still fall about \$500 million short of anticipated expenses, he said.

Execution of rapist delayed

HUNTSVILLE (AP) — An appeals court judge granted an execution stay Monday for a Texas inmate scheduled to die by lethal injection before dawn Wednesday.

U.S. District Judge David C. Belew Jr. of Fort Worth granted the reprieve for Randy D. Mayo, 26, said Bonnie V. Roder, the judge's spokeswoman. She did not know on what grounds the stay had been issued.

Mayo was convicted for the April 13, 1984 rape-kidnap-murder of Kimberly Sue Reeves, a student at an Angelo State University.

Mayo's attorney, Kirk Havelle of San Angelo, filed an appeal with the court claiming Mayo had been denied a fair trial because of juror misconduct and because Mayo's voluntary confession was used against him during his trial, said court clerk Sherry Erwin.

Sheriff found guilty of mailing child porn

DALLAS (AP) — Suspended Montague County Sheriff Harry Walker was convicted on four counts of mailing child pornography Monday and faces up to 40 years in prison and a \$1 million fine, authorities said.

The trial was held before U.S. District Judge Jerry Buchmeyer after both sides agreed to a written stipulation of testimony and Walker waived a jury and had the judge decide his guilt or innocence, Assistant U.S. Attorney Denver McCarty said.

Walker was arrested May 1 at a Montague County post office and was indicted by a federal grand jury in Dallas later that month. The original indictment charged Walker with two counts of sexual exploitation of a minor and eight counts of mailing a sexually explicit photograph.

The sheriff was arrested after undercover agents began corresponding with people whose names were found on a mailing list seized by Angeles authorities, McCarty said.

He said Walker waived his right to a jury. He said the agreement between the defense and prosecution agreed about what the verdict would have said, if called to stand.

Buchmeyer found Walker guilty on all four counts and set a sentence for Sept. 12, McCarty said.

The defense plans to appeal the case to the 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals, McCarty said.

McCarty said there was little agreement between attorneys about facts of the case, but Walker's attorney had raised questions of speech and right to privacy in trial motions.

Walker faces a maximum sentence of 40 years and a fine of \$1 million, McCarty said, but has been jailed since his arrest.

Jury selection underway in videotaped murder case

LONGVIEW (AP) — Jury selection and national television broadcast began Monday in the capital murder trial of a former high school basketball star charged with killing a teenager in a convenience store robbery that was taped by security cameras.

Marvin Maurice Wells, a former athletic standout, is accused in the shooting death of Matt McKay, 17, of Oklahoma.

McKay was shot in the back during a robbery by three men at the PDQ Texaco convenience store in Carrollton Nov. 21, 1985. He died in a Dallas hospital about two weeks later.

The slaying was captured on videotape by the store's security camera and the tape was aired on local and national television broadcast.

Because of the exposure, District Judge John Ovard called the trial from Dallas on a closed-circuit order. Ovard said the continuous television broadcasts make it difficult to select a jury.

The jury selection process started Monday, is expected to last up to six weeks, officials said.

Wells, a member of two championship basketball teams at Flint Central High School in Longview, was arrested by Flint police 17 after a Dallas County grand jury indicted him in connection with the robbery at a Mesquite convenience store Dec. 1, 1985.
