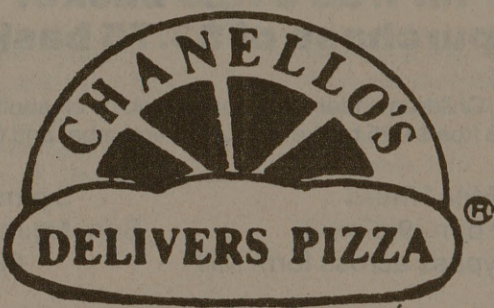

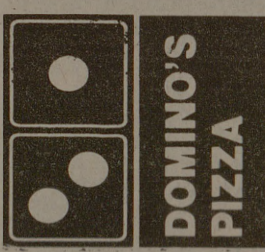

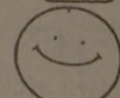

Zimbabwe says U.S. hostile to non-aligned nations group

HARARE, Zimbabwe (AP)—Zim-
babwe on Wednesday accused the
United States of deep-rooted hosti-
lity against the non-aligned
movement, but Singapore said the
101-member group has lost credi-
tibility because it constantly ата-
Washington while shielding Mos-
cow.

On the third day of a week-long
summit, delegates headed into a
marathon session. Many of the
lengthy speeches were filled with
anti-American rhetoric.

The movement, founded Sept. 1,
1961, will be led for the next three
years by Zimbabwean Prime Min-
ister Robert Mugabe. Members of
the non-aligned movement profess
to have no binding ties to either the
United States or the Soviet Union.

Libyan leader Col. Moammar
Gadhafi arrived at the conference
center in flowing white robes and
was accompanied by about 50 Li-
byan demonstrators who shouted
"Down with (President) Reagan,
down with (British Prime Minister)
Margaret Thatcher."
The Harare summit was Gadhafi's
first known foreign appearance
since the United States bombed Li-
bya April 15 after accusing Gadhafi
of instigating international terro-
rism.

The demonstrators who accom-
panied Gadhafi to the conference
center were his disarmed bodyguard,
said a Zimbabwean official who
spoke on condition of anonymity.
They turned out again when Gad-
hafi left for lunch.

In Uganda, the government an-
nounced Gadhafi would visit the
East African nation today, leaving
the Harare summit with Uganda's
President Yoweri Museveni and
Burkina Faso's military ruler, Cap-
tain Thomas Sankara.

In a Zimbabwean television in-
terview Wednesday, Gadhafi reit-
erated a pledge to support rebels in the
African state of Chad and help
guerrillas seeking to overthrow the
South African government.

In Washington, meanwhile, State
Department spokesman Charles
Redman rejected an assertion by Cu-
ban leader Fidel Castro that Cuba
has a right to maintain troops in
Marxist Angola.

Castro told the summit Tues-
day that Cuba would keep its troops in
Angola as long as there is apartheid
in South Africa. Cuba has stationed
about 25,000 in Angola for the last
10 years.

South Africa administers neigh-
boring Namibia, or South-West Af-
rica, under a League of Nations
mandate rescinded by the United
Nations. South Africa says pre-inde-
pendence elections cannot take place
until the Cubans leave Angola.

Angola is the base for guerrilla
fighting to end South African con-
trol of Namibia.

Zimbabwean Information Min-
ister Nathan Shamuyarira said State
Department complaints about anti-
Americanism at the summit reflect
long-standing U.S. antagonism.

"From the very beginning, the
United States has been against the
non-aligned movement," Shamuy-
arira told a news conference.

The minister shrugged off State
Department confirmation of a pro-
vision U.S. threat to withhold \$300
million in aid because of what it con-
siders Zimbabwean rudeness.

1,000 space workers may be laid off

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP)—
As many as 1,000 space workers
are expected to receive layoff notices
within a few days because of a slow-
down in activity resulting from the
explosion of the space shuttle Col-
umbia, industry sources said
Wednesday.

Those losing jobs will be contrac-
tor personnel working on the shuttle
processing contract. They are em-
ployed by Lockheed Space Opera-
tions Co., Grumman Technical Ser-
vices Co., Morton Thiokol Inc. and
Pan Am World Services Inc.

Other Kennedy Space Center con-
tractors also are expected to reduce
their work forces before the new fi-
scal year begins Oct. 1, said in-
dustry sources, who spoke on condition
they not be identified.

The National Aeronautics and
Space Administration said only the
companies are working on re-
ducing their staffs to match require-
ments of the agency's fiscal 1987
budget.

No NASA employees are ex-
pected to be laid off.

About 1,200 contractor employees
here already have lost their jobs
since the Jan. 28 explosion of the
Challenger that killed seven crew
members. Shuttle flights are not ex-
pected to resume until 1988.
