

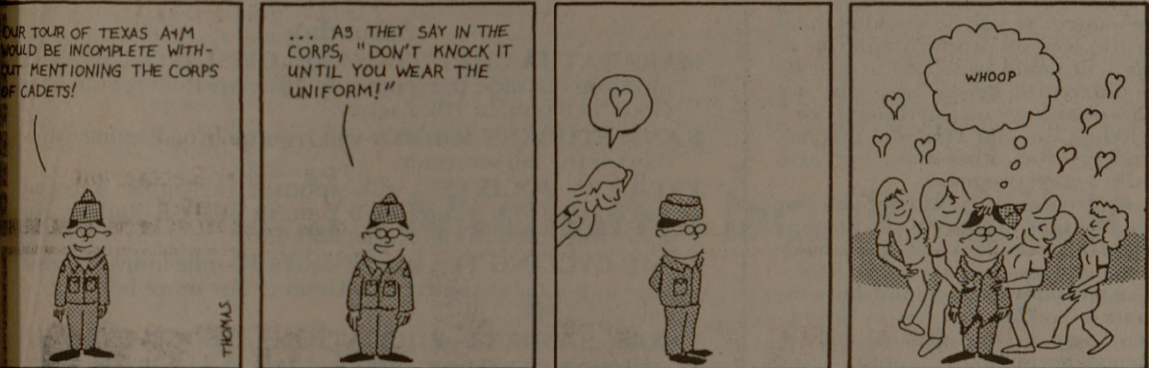

OPAS and Town Hall slated for MSC Council discussion

The Memorial Student Center Council will discuss the new Broadway season and report on the outcome of its fall leadership conference Monday at 7:30 p.m. in room 216T of the MSC during its first meeting of the semester. The MSC Council, an organization composed of both students and faculty members, organizes and arranges for a variety of campus programs. Bobby Bisor, MSC Council chairman, said one topic at the meeting Monday will be an update from the Opera and Performing Arts Society (OPAS) about ticket information and contributions. OPAS is an MSC committee which presents a variety of classical and cultural entertainment to Texas A&M and the surrounding areas. Bisor said MSC Town Hall's new Broadway season, which will include four new programs, also will be discussed. The council meeting is open to all students.

Authorities seek diary of officer

SAN ANTONIO (AP) — Investigators in the shooting death of San Antonio policeman Stephen Smith were looking for a vigilante diary they think Smith may have used to record acts of vandalism and possibly assassination.

The *San Antonio Light* reported Thursday that the book may have been lost because the police department "failed to secure Smith's apartment after his death, and the officer's belongings were removed."

Smith, a seven-year veteran of the police force, was shot by fellow officer Farrell Tucker on Aug. 18.

Since then, authorities have said they are investigating whether other individuals might be involved in Smith's alleged vigilante activities.

The Bexar County grand jury investigation of the shooting case officially began Wednesday when Special Prosecutor Sid Harle obtained several subpoenas, including those for Smith's widow and his younger brother.

The search for the diary began after investigators discovered that Smith used to brag to fellow officers and others about his actions.

"Smith unquestionably had a 'Dirty Harry' complex and liked to brag about the things he did," the *Light* reported, quoting an unnamed source.

The newspaper said sources told it that Smith had bragged about keeping a diary of his alleged vigilante acts and those who participated in them.

Faculty Senate to discuss A&M, System organization

A committee report describing serious problems with the current organization of the Texas A&M University and System will dominate the opening session of the Faculty Senate, as well as the traditional guest presentation given to the Senate by University President Frank E. Vandiver. The TAMU University-System Organization Subcommittee was created in 1984 to examine the organizational structure of the TAMU System and its effects on A&M faculty. In its report, the committee has concluded that "the system works only because of current incumbent's efforts to make the system work." The report also states that an unnecessary burden has been created and effects the faculty's responsibilities in teaching, research, and extension. A number of suggestions in the report are recommended to eliminate these problems and to "maximize the potential" for several programs. The Senate also will hear recommendations for approval of several new courses.

Man gets death in shooting case

VICTORIA (AP) — A San Antonio man convicted of the September 1985 shooting death of a banker's wife was sentenced to die by injection Thursday after less than four hours of jury deliberation. Lesley Lee Gosch, 31, stared at his attorney Rick Woods while the court clerk read the verdict that the shoot-

ing death of Rebecca Jo Patton was deliberate.

Assistant Bexar County District Attorney Sam Ponder said, "I'm satisfied justice was done. It was the proper verdict."

But Woods said he is confident the verdict will be reversed. During closing arguments Thurs-

day morning, prosecutors contended Gosch masterminded a botched extortion and Patton's murder.

Patton, 42, was shot in the head seven times during an extortion attempt in her home by Gosch and alleged accomplice John Laurence Rogers, testimony showed.
