

Odds of adoption small for 100,000 black children

HARRISBURG, Pa. (AP) — More than 100,000 black children younger than 18 are waiting to be adopted.

Each year, thousands of couples place their names on seemingly endless waiting lists, hoping for a healthy white baby. They know they will wait years.

Yet many healthy black babies are available for adoption, although the odds are good they will wait years for a family — if they ever find one.

By the time they reach 2, children who have not been adopted are put into a hard-to-place category, meaning their age has made the odds against them finding a suitable family greater.

Black babies are put into the category as newborns, according to Wahnetta Williams of Tressler Lutheran Services.

While black children can be placed with white families, Williams, who is a black adoptive parent, sees some real advantages to placing them in black homes.

The child will grow up knowing about his culture and developing an ethnic identity, she said. He or she will be exposed to certain foods and customs otherwise lacking.

Williams is in charge of recruitment for Tressler's program, which tries to find black families willing to adopt a black child.

"We're just not getting the families," she said. "Black people are not aware of adoption."

They have misconceptions about the adoption process; they think it is an expensive undertaking, she said.

The entire adoption process costs about \$900 through Tressler, Williams said, and many times, the total is less because various agencies contribute. Private adoptions can cost up to several thousand dollars.

Adoptive parents are required to take part in a nine-week training session.

According to Williams, the sessions are not about parenting, but about adoption and the needs of the adopted child.

"Really what it's all about is can you love a child, not can you pay the bill," Williams said.

She and her husband, Gerald, know.

In 1983, after rearing three children, they adopted their first child, Matthew, then 3.

Since then, they have adopted six more black children, most recently an infant.

Three years ago Tressler started a local "One Church, One Child" program.

First started by a minister in Chicago after he adopted a teen-ager, the goal of the program was to have

a black family from each of the churches in the area adopt a child.

During the first few months, the program was popular and resulted in placements for several black children in the Harrisburg area. One of those children was Matthew.

Since that time, however, the city has worn off, and people seem to be unaware of the need for black families to adopt, Williams said.

Feminists say word usage 'man-ipulates'

CHAMPAIGN, Ill. (AP) — Words are power, and women who have grown up with words such as "businessman," "spoke man" and "mankind" aren't getting their share, the co-authors of "A Feminist Dictionary" say.

"There's a growing body of research that demonstrates... the women and girls feel excluded by a number of those terms," said Paula A. Treichler, assistant professor of medical humanities at social sciences at the University of Illinois' medical school in Urbana-Champaign.

Treichler says she and Charles Kramarae, both linguists, put the book together to combat the inequalities of common speech.

"Language is part of everyday reality and can be empowering, disempowering in things we do every day," Treichler says.

A recent study showed the effect on teen-age girls and boys help-wanted ads that say "man," "male" or "he," she says.

Treichler, who received her doctorate in linguistics from the University of Illinois in 1972, said that when women are left out of the language, they're also excluded from opportunities.

"There is overwhelming evidence that to be left out repeatedly is an alienating experience for women," she says. "Even in medical schools, it is typical to refer to students and physicians as 'he.'"

"In some medical schools, the enrollment of women is up to 50 percent. It's absurd to retain the pronoun in the face of such enormous social change."
