

## South Africa executes with little public outcry

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa (AP) — Three black insurgents, including a 19-year-old convicted in a van der Westhuizen said. bombing that killed five whites, were hanged Tuesday after refusing to seek clemency.

U.S. civil rights leader Coretta Scott King, meanwhile, canceled a meeting with President P.W. Botha at the last minute. She announced her decision a day after leading antiapartheid activists said they would not see her if she met with Botha.

The execution of the rebels, members of the outlawed African National Congress guerrilla group, caused little public outcry.
