## Report: Small 2-door cars show worst record for injuries, repairs

WASHINGTON (AP) — Motorists are likely to be safer and face lower collision repair costs in large, four-door cars, station wagons and vans, according to an insurance industry report released Thursday.

The study by the Highway Loss Data Institute, an affiliate of the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety, shows small 2-door models and many small or mid-size sport or specialty cars as having the worst injury and repair record.

Many of those small cars show injury claim frequencies and repair losses at least 30 percent higher than average, while many large cars, station wagons and vans typically show 40 percent to 50 percent better-than-average claim records, according to the analysis.

Government crash tests on a variety of cars over the years have shown little direct relationship between car size and how well occupants are protected from serious injury.

But auto safety experts emphasize that those test crashes were into a fixed barrier, which does not take into account the differences in size and weight among cars.

A crash into a fixed barrier would be the same as a crash into another car of the same size traveling at the same speed. Most actual auto accidents do not occur that way.

Among the best station wagon and van performers were the size Volvo 240, and the large Pontiac Parisienne, Buick LeSabre and Mercury Grand Marquis.

In the large luxury car or van category, the Mercedes 560SL and the Cadillac Brougham showed a likelihood of injury 19 percent to 49 percent below average.

By comparison, most small car models as well as many small cars showed significantly higher chances of injury and substantial higher-than-average repair costs.

Of 48 small 2-door or 4-door models, 19 had injury losses of 30 percent more above average and 17 had repair costs substantially above average.

The highest collision repair loss among all the cars went to the Mini Starion, which had repair costs 100 percent above average.

## Tax overhaul results include increase in cost for renters

NEW YORK (AP) — The contents of two recent documents suggest big financial problems for America's growing population of renters.

The first document is the Tax Reform Act of 1986, soon to be passed by Congress and signed by the president. The other is a study entitled "Home Ownership and Housing Affordability" by the Joint Center for Housing Studies.

As written, the tax overhaul measure is likely to result in higher rents. By general consensus, the law will be death for tax shelters which resulted in increased housing construction. The impact, in terms of less rental construction, already has begun.

While new housing financed by tax-shelters almost never is available to those lowest on the economic scale, it does add to the supply of housing stock, and allows the poor to inhabit the least desirable units as others vacate them.

The act also would lessen depreciation of real estate assets for all investors and place limitations on deductibility of interest, in addition to raising capital gains taxes.

Deloitte Haskins & Sells, a large accounting firm, sums up the impact with this view: "As the tax benefits of rental real estate are removed or reduced, rents will have to rise if the rates of return are to be maintained."

The Joint Center findings document the already precarious situation of many renters.

Thirty-five percent of U.S. households rented their own housing in 1983, the latest year used in the study.

Households in the lowest income class made up 40 percent of all renter households.

The median rent burden of all renters went from 20 percent of income in 1970, to 27 percent in 1980, to 29 percent in 1983.

The share of households with rent burdens above 75 percent of income rose to 13 percent from 8 percent in the 1974-1983 period.

In 1974, the median rent burden for households in the lowest income class was 35 percent of income. By 1983, the median rent burden for households in this income class had risen to 46 percent.

That is the situation found by the Joint Center in 1983. In its report issued this year for National Gypsum Co., Dallas, the center reached an unusually pertinent conclusion.

Whether the problem abates or worsens, it stated, depends on the economy, future federal housing subsidies, "and the tax treatment of rental housing that emerges from the current congressional debate over tax reform."
