## Panel identifies slain officer as gunman in 1982 killing

SAN ANTONIO (AP) — Slain police officer Stephen R. Smith apparently was the gunman in a 1982 slaying and is a suspect in two more ambush killings, a special panel of investigators has concluded.

The panel identified Smith as the killer of suspected auto burglar Ternell R. Folsom, 22, who was shot out-

side a San Antonio apartment on Dec. 28, 1982, police said. Police said Smith was shot to death on Aug. 18 by fellow police of-ficer Farrell Tucker.

Capt. James Despres said, "We will confirm that we have informa-tion which leads to the implication of Stephen Smith in three separate murders.

He said Smith is a suspect in two

other homicides: • The March 28, 1985 slaving of Clarence Leonal Cain Jr., at about 1:30 a.m.

• The Aug. 31, 1985 shooting of Adolfo Cuellar Jr., as he sat with some friends about 3:30 a.m.
