**A&M women's tennis team
fares well in season opening**

The Texas A&M women's tennis team kicked off the fall season in grand style this weekend as members of the team won both the singles and doubles titles of the Texas A&M Four-Way Tennis Tournament held at the Omar Smith Tennis Center.

Because the tournament was based on individual performance rather than team play, third-seeded Kim Labuschagne of A&M faced teammate Karen Marshall, the No. 1 seed, in the singles final. Labuschagne downed Marshall 6-1, 6-1 to take the singles crown.

Labuschagne said she tried to block out the thoughts about playing a teammate in a finals match.

"I just think of her as an opponent, not as Karen," she said. "I just play the tennis ball. It didn't put any pressure on me."

In doubles action, the top-seeded team of Labuschagne and Marshall overcame a slow start and a weather delay due to heavy showers to defeat second-seeded Cathy O'Donovan and Dianne Lowings of the University of Southwestern Louisiana, 3-6, 6-1, 6-3.

Labuschagne played near-perfect tennis throughout the tournament, breezing past her first two opponents in straight sets. She easily handled unseeded Wendy Elsey of Southwest Texas State University in the first round and trounced Susan Mainz of USL in the second. Lowings was the first person to score a game against her in losing 6-1, 6-1 in the third round.

Other Aggies also fared well. Seventh-seeded freshman Cindy Marshall advanced to the semifinals in singles play before losing to Marshall, 6-0, 6-2, and sophomore Kellie Dorman made it to the consolation finals before falling to SWTSU's Melissa Martin, 6-3, 6-2.

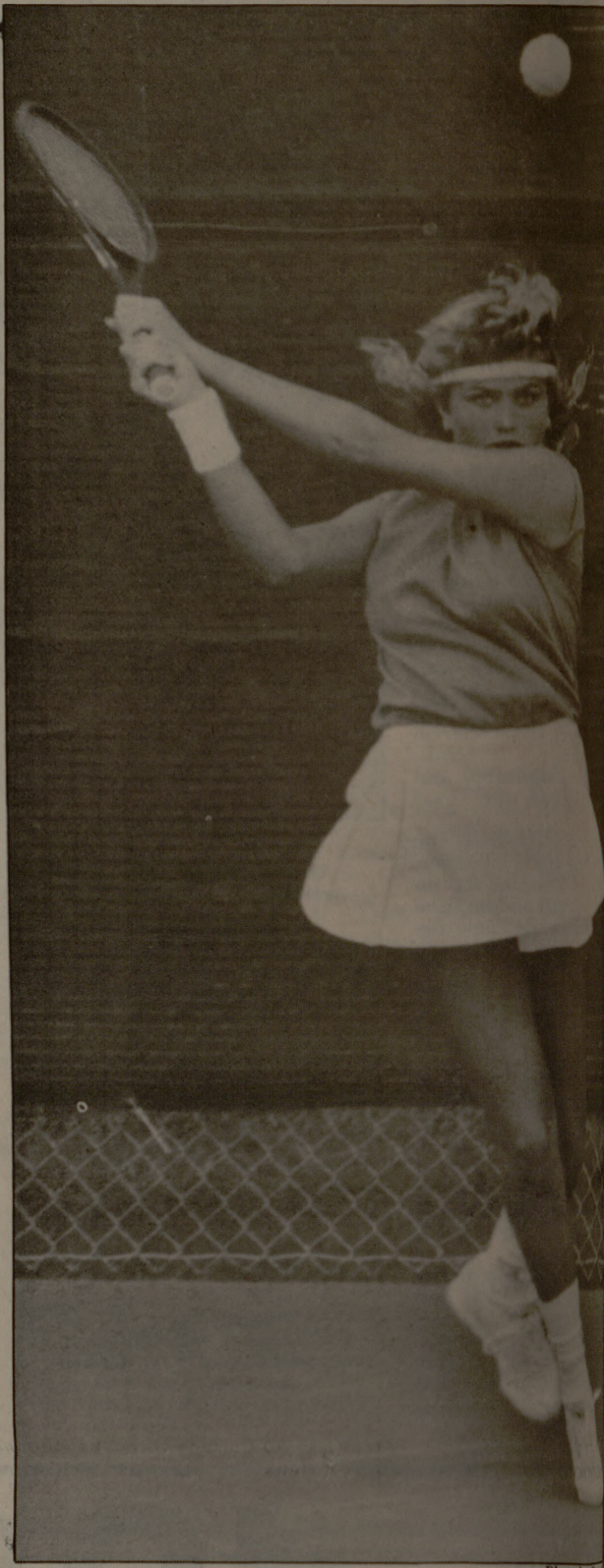
A&M's Gaye Lynne Gensler, the No. 2 seed, advanced to the fourth round before losing a hard-fought match to O'Donovan, 6-2, 5-7, 6-4. The doubles team of Gensler and Crawford advanced to the semifinals of the doubles tournament before losing to O'Donovan and Lowings.

A&M Coach Bobby Kleinecke said he was pleased with his team's showing in the tournament.

"I think it's obvious that Kim had an excellent tournament," he said. "She came out with a lot of intensity and she played really well."

Kleinecke said he was happy with the way the A&M players bounced back from adversity during the tournament.

"The thing that made us great last year was that the whole team made corrections and came back from every setback," he said. "I think it'll be the same way this year."
