

# team A&M grabs softball tourney opens to begin fall season at 6-0

The Texas A&M softball team opened up its fall season in impressive fashion by winning the Fall Maverick Invitational tournament in Arlington this weekend.

The Aggies went 6-0 in the tournament, scoring 42 runs on 61 hits, while giving up only four. A&M also posted error-free softball in the money.

"We did play real well, and we didn't make many mistakes for this early in the season — I think that's the key," Head Coach Bob Brock said.

This was A&M's first competition with the pitching mound 43 feet away from the plate instead of the 46-foot distance used in previous years.

But Brock said the mound change seemed to affect the other teams in the tournament more than it did the Aggies.

"The extra three feet has helped our hitters a lot," he said. "We just hit and ran and bunted like we've never done before."

"It had just a marginal effect on our pitchers, though."

(Julie) Carpenter kind of pitched the same way. She never was a big strikeout pitcher, but she did a good job.

"It's taken a little touch of the overpowering thing off Shawn (Andaya) — just a teeny bit."

Heidly, who was A&M's catcher last year.

"We tended to play Renee more than Carrie at third because Carrie was catching, too," Brock said.

"Kelli needed to nail down that first-base spot and she really did a super job taking that over," he said.

Brock said the Aggies' victory was a definite confidence-builder.

"They're just happy to see all the hard work pay off," he said. "The older players are happy to see the younger players coming together."

Brock said he liked what he saw at the tournament but doesn't want to build up this victory too much.

The Aggies will play a double-header Wednesday against Sam Houston State University in Huntsville.

## Chiefs handle Oilers

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — Two days after Houston cut him adrift, Greg Hill knows the sweet taste of revenge.

Intercepting a wobbly Warren Moon pass Sunday, Hill romped 26 yards for a touchdown that helped the Kansas City Chiefs nail down a 13-3 victory over the Oilers.

"Once I had the ball in my hands I knew I was going to score because it was clear sailing," said Hill, part of a defensive charge that harried Moon all day.

After seizing a quick early lead, the Chiefs' defense, led by linemen Art Maas and Art Still, spent the day nagging in on Moon, who threw two interceptions and was only 18-for-40 for 229 yards.

Hill's touchdown return put the Chiefs on top 27-0, then all the momentum shifted to the Oilers.

After scoring two quick touchdowns, Houston drove to a first-and-goal at the 1-yard line midway through the fourth quarter. But Scott Radevic threw Chuck Banks for a 3-yard loss on second down, then Moon missed on two straight passes.

Moon, who had not been sacked in Houston's two previous games, was sacked seven times by the swarming Chiefs' defense.

The Chiefs, 2-1, dominated from the outset, building a 13-0 halftime lead on Todd Blackledge's 29-yard touchdown pass to Carlos Carson and two Nick Lowery field goals.

## Ag golfers finish sixth

EDMOND, Okla. — The Texas A&M women's golf team finished sixth out of 12 teams at the All-College Classic tournament Sunday at the Kickingbird Golf Course.

Oklahoma State won the tournament with a total of 882 strokes, while A&M finished with 946.

Fiona Connor shot a 9-over-par 222 for the Aggies to earn her a fourth-place individual finish in the three-round tourney.

## Dallas falls to Atlanta on 18-yard field goal

IRVING (AP) — Atlanta quarterback Dave Archer, working without timeouts, drove the Atlanta Falcons 79 yards to the Dallas 1-yard line where Mick Luckhurst kicked an 18-yard field goal with 20 seconds left Sunday for a come-from-behind 37-35 NFL victory over the stunned Cowboys.

Atlanta, beating Dallas for the first time in 10 years, is 3-0 for the season, while the Cowboys dropped to 2-1.

Dallas quarterback Danny White, who needed acupuncture treatments for a pulled thigh to play, rifled four touchdown passes, including a 22-yarder to rookie Mike Sherrard with 9:05 to go for a 35-27 lead.

Atlanta's Gerald Riggs scored on a 2-yard run with 3:28 on the clock to bring the Falcons to within a point.

On second and 18 from the Atlanta 12, Archer completed a 21-yard pass to Ken Whisenhunt.

Floyd Dixon hauled down a 65-yard pass from Archer to the Dallas 2.

The ball was moved to the 1-yard line on a holding call, then Luckhurst kicked his third field goal of the day.

The Cowboys weren't through. Tony Hill stepped out of bounds on the Atlanta 8-yard line on the final play of the game, a 60-yard pass from White.

The Falcons scored twice in 60 seconds to secure a 27-21 lead in the third quarter.

White struck back on a 7-yard touchdown pass to Hill to give Dallas a 28-27 lead.

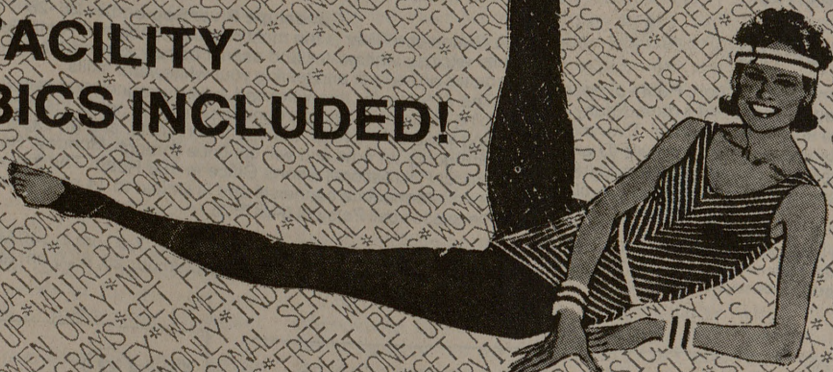
Timmy Newsome scored two touchdowns in 22 seconds to give Dallas a 21-13 halftime lead — one on 1-yard run with 1:47 left in the half and the other on a 2-yard pass play after Dallas forced an Atlanta fumble.

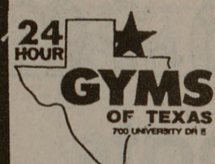

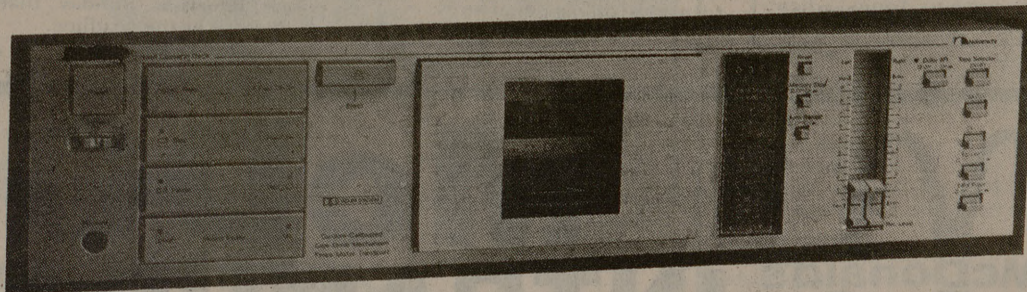
