MILWAUKEE (AP) — George samberger announced his second effrement as manager of the Milvaukee Brewers on Thursday, sayng he was "just being realistic" after Al years in baseball.

"I said, 'What am I doing here? I should be back in Florida,'" Bamberger, 61; said. The Brewers are in place in the American League East Division.


