

BEAUFORT, S.C. — Searchers found two helmets and a life vest Thursday that they believe belonged to a former commander of Texas A&M Corps of Cadets and another Marine missing since Tuesday when their fighter jet fell into the Atlantic after colliding with another fighter, Coast Guard officials in Mi-

The search for the two missing men continued into Thursday night. Coast Guard officials said they would re-evaluate their search plans for the men this morning.

The missing men have been identified as pilot, 1st Lt. Charles Kelly Castleberry Jr., 26, Class of '82, of Lake Jackson, Texas; and a radar intercept officer, Maj. Christopher J. Brammer, 37, of Cortez, Colo.

Castleberry was Corps commander in 1981-82, the top-ranking student officer. He received the

WASHINGTON (AP) — Pending anti-drug legislation would boost

Texas efforts to halt the flow of nar-

"Our legislation will implement portions of the Operation Alliance plan worked out with the adminis-tration earlier," said Gramm, a pri-mary co-sponsor of the bill. "It will bring new clout to Texas in the bat-
