Aggies grab two victories

WICHITA FALLS — The Texas A&M men's tennis team registered two singles victories and a couple near-misses Sunday over Southern Methodist at the Wichita Falls Invitational.

Men's Tennis

In the No. 3 singles, A&M's Dean Johnson beat John Ross 1-6, 7-6, 6-2, while Aggie Chris Stanich dominated John Coyle 6-1, 6-2 in the No. 5 singles match.

At No. 1 singles, A&M's Marcel Vos lost a tough three-set battle to Richie Reneberg, the nation's top collegiate player, 6-7, 6-3, 4-6. A&M's Brent Haygarth had match

point in the second set of his No. 4 singles match with Stefan Kruger, but Kruger came back to down Haygarth 3-6, 7-6, 6-2.

"All in all we just played outstanding tennis," A&M Coach David Kent said. "I'm really high on this team. This shows we can play with SMU (currently the nation's top-ranked team) and anybody."

In other singles play, A&M's Wayne Green, inserted for an injured Dean Goldfine, lost to Den Bishop 1-6, 0-6. Goldfine played Friday and beat TCU's Neal Broad, but was sidelined for the remainder of

the tourney with a nagging sprained ankle.

SMU's Brian Devenning defeated A&M's James Frank 7-5, 2-6, 6-4 in No. 6 singles play Frank filled in for Steve Kennedy, who sat out Sunday with mononucleosis.

In doubles play, the team of Ross-Kruger beat Vos-Green 7-5, 7-5, while Reneberg-Bishop defeated Haygarth-Johnson 7-5, 3-6, 7-6. Devenning-Coyle beat Stanich-Frank 2-6, 6-1, 6-1.

The Aggies picked up four wins against TCU on Friday and two over Oklahoma State on Saturday in the four-team tourney.

Steelers' overtime TD drops Oilers, 22-16

HOUSTON (AP) — Pittsburgh's Rick Woods returned a punt 41 yards in overtime to set up Walter Abercrombie's 3-yard touchdown run that gave the Steelers a 22-16 NFL victory Sunday over the Houston Oilers.

Steelers quarterback Mark Malone scrambled 11 yards on a bootleg prior to Abercrombie's scoring run that gave Pittsburgh its first win of the year, snapping a three-game losing streak.

Pittsburgh's Gary Anderson kicked his third field goal of the game, a 28-yarder, to give the Steelers a 16-13 lead with 2:23 seconds left in regulation play. Malone ran 45 yards on another bootleg play to set up Anderson's kick.

But Houston quarterback Warren Moon rallied the Oilers with six straight completions to set up a 23-yard field goal by Tony Zendejas with 45 seconds left, sending the game into overtime.

Anderson, who had never missed a field goal in 10 attempts in the As-

trodome, missed a 36-yard try in the first quarter. But his 45-yarder with 2:23 to go in the third quarter put Pittsburgh ahead for the first time in a game this year, 13-10.

Houston drove back to tie it with 9:56 left in the game on Zendejas' second field goal, a 29-yarder.

The Oilers' offense struggled throughout the first half but came to life after rookie Allen Pinkett's 48-yard kickoff return. Moon hit rookie Ernest Givins on a 35-yard touchdown pass with 18 seconds left in the half for a 10-3 lead.

Calvin Sweeney, playing for the injured John Stallworth, caught a 24-yard pass from Malone to set up his own 19-yard touchdown catch with 8:57 gone in the third quarter.

Houston took a 3-0 lead on Zendejas' 45-yard field goal early in the first quarter after safety Bo Eason returned an interception five yards to Pittsburgh's 38. Anderson kicked his first field goal with 1:07 left in the first half.
