

#### **Broncos buck Pokes**

DENVER (AP) — John Elway threw three touchdown passes, Ger-ald Willhite scored three times and Karl Mecklenburg and Rulon Jones led a dominating defense as un-beaten Denver erupted for 22 sec-ond-quarter points and shut down undermanned Dallas 29-14 Sunday.

Two of Willhite's touchdowns came on nine- and 15-yard passes from Elway and the third was a oneyard leap set up by a 50-yard com-pletion from Elway to rookie Mark lackson.
