## Concerts in Roundtop provide a rustic retreat

If the mid-term blues have got you down, and the Northgate scene just doesn't do the trick anymore, then why not try a quick road trip to Dallas, Austin, or perhaps Roundtop, Texas.

*Roundtop?* You may find yourself wondering what in the heck you could possibly do for excitement in Roundtop. But wonder no more, because the International Festival-Institute has a cultural cure for your study blahs.

Set in the rustic scenery and open-air isolation that surrounds Roundtop, the institute will present the third set of concerts in its "August-to-April" series next weekend, featuring violinist Joseph Genauldi and pianist Eugene Rowley.

Together the musicians will perform sonatas by Mozart and Brahms, and Genauldi will also perform Bach Sonata #1 in G minor for solo violin. The concerts will begin at 3 p.m. on October 25th and

26th in the Parlours of the William Lockhart Clayton House on Festival Hill.

Tickets are \$7.50 per person, and may be purchased at the door. To get to Festival Hill, take Highway 60 out of College Station until it hits Highway 36. Turn south on 36 towards Brenham and then turn west on Highway 290 (towards Austin). Then turn left when you reach Highway 237, and follow the winding road until you reach Festival Hill.

## Town Hall Broadway rises with 'Superstar'

MSC Town Hall Broadway will kick off its 1986-87 season Nov. 6 with "Jesus Christ Superstar," a rock opera about Christ's last days.

Town Hall Broadway is making a comeback after facing hitches in scheduling and financing for this season. The committee has regrouped and put a new schedule together.

The next performance will be the National Shakespeare Company's production of Shakespeare's "Romeo and Juliet" on Feb. 14, followed by Cole Porter's "Can Can" on March 1. Then William Windom will bring his one-man show on humorist James Thurber to A&M on April 23.

Season tickets sales begin Wednesday. They range in price from \$38 to \$59.25 for the general public, and \$35 to \$50.50 for students.

Tickets for "Jesus Christ Superstar," which go on sale Oct. 27, are \$17.75, \$14.25 and \$11.50 for students, and \$21, \$16.75 and \$13.50 for the general public.
