A&M vs. Rice: A glance at the series

The Rice Owls were Texas A&M's first Southwest Conference opponent when the teams played on Nov. 8, 1915. Rice won that one 7-0, but the Aggies hold the overall lead with 40 wins, 27 losses and three ties.

A few highlights from past Rice-A&M contests:

- 1985 — A&M defensive back Domingo Bryant intercepts three passes, one for a touchdown, in 43-28 A&M win.
- 1983 — Freshman quarterback Kevin Murray completes 25 passes (a career high tied last week vs. Baylor) to lead A&M to 29-10 win.
- 1982 — Senior quarterback Gary Kubiak tosses five touchdown passes as Aggies romp 49-7.
- 1981 — Kubiak sets SWC record with six touchdown passes. A&M's 51-26 victory, was the most points the Aggies scored under coach Tom Wilson.
- 1980 — Rice wins 10-6, its only victory against A&M in the 1980s so far.
- 1978 — Sophomore quarterback Mike Mosely throws a touchdown pass to Gerald Carter on the first offensive play with Wilson as head coach. A&M wins 38-21.
- 1976 — Sophomore place-kicker Tony Franklin sets SWC record with five field goals in 57-34 win. A&M gains 622 yards in total offense — its first time over 600 yards.
- 1975 — Freshman fullback George Woodard powers A&M to second-half comeback in 33-14 victory for A&M's ninth straight win that season.
- 1974 — Junior linebacker Ed Simonini forces fumble which is caught in the air and returned for a touchdown by junior defensive back Pat Thomas. Aggies win big, 37-9.
- 1973 — Aggies down 17-0 (sound familiar?), but come back in second half to take 20-17 lead. However, Rice's Carl Sweric returns ensuing kickoff 95 yards for a touchdown. A&M loses 24-20. A&M has not allowed a kickoff return for a touchdown since Sweric's feat.
- 1972 — A&M blows 14-0 first-quarter lead and loses 20-14.
- 1968 — Both teams' offenses on fire at outset, as first five possessions result in touchdowns. Charley Riggs kicks field goal in the fourth quarter to cement 24-14 A&M win.
- 1967 — Tommy Maxwell catches short touchdown pass from Edd Hargett in fourth quarter as A&M defeats Rice 18-3.
- 1966 — Owls' left-footed place-kicker Richard Putska misses four short field goals. Rice scores touchdown in fourth quarter but point conversion fails. A&M wins 6-0.
- 1959 — A&M loses 7-0 the second time in its history. A game with just a seven-minute time was against TCU in 1957-2).
- 1957 — November 16, last time A&M has been in college football polls. Pat Bryant's Aggies were 84th in Post writer Jack Gallagher's story that day that Bryant was Alabama's coach in 1958. Rice 7-6 and heads to its last game. Also on that day, Rice 47-game win streak ends in loss to Notre Dame at Neman.
- In one of SWC's comeback, A&M overcame deficit in final period to win 10-7.

A&M hall of fame to induct four All-Americans

Four former All-America football players for Texas A&M will be inducted into the Texas A&M Athletic Hall of Fame during a ceremony prior to Saturday's 2 p.m. kickoff between A&M and Rice.

The inductees are Pat Thomas, Garth Ten Napel, Billy Hobbs and Charles Henke.

Thomas, a cornerback in 1974 and 1975, was a member of the 1975 defensive unit that led the nation in rushing defense and total defense. After playing professional football for seven years with the Los Angeles Rams, Thomas coached for the Houston Gamblers and New Jersey Generals of the USFL. He was named All-Pro and All-NFL two years and played in the 1979 Super Bowl. Thomas now resides in Plano.

Ten Napel, a linebacker from 1973-75, was named All-America in 1975 and was selected to the All-Southwest Conference team in 1974 and 1975.

Ten Napel led the Aggies those two years in tackles, fumbles caused, fumble recoveries and quarterback sacks. He graduated from A&M in 1981 with an engineering degree and now lives in Kemp, Texas.

Hobbs was a member of the 1967 A&M team which beat Alabama in the 1968 Cotton Bowl. He was named All-America in 1967 and 1968 and earned SWC Player of the Year honors twice.

Hobbs, who now resides in Amarillo, still holds A&M records for most return yardage in a game (132 against TCU in 1967) and the longest return of an interception for

touchdown (100 yards in 1966 game).

Henke played on A&M's national championship team as guard from 1938-40. He was named to the All-time Cotton Bowl team in 1940, the year he won All-America honors.

Henke was selected as one of the top 10 men in annual history when he graduated in 1940. He was unable to play for the Steelers and Brooklyn Dodgers because of military service. Henke on the Army's East All-Star team and lives in Houston.
