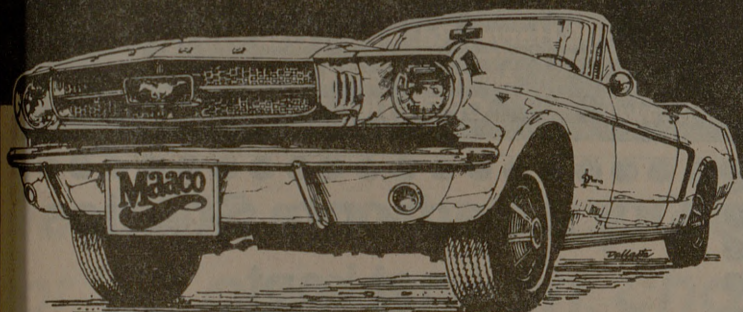

Baylor awarded \$7.5 million for comet research project

WACO (AP) — NASA has awarded a \$7.5 million research grant to Baylor University physicists to study comet dust and perhaps give weather forecasters a better idea of when and where rain will fall.

The grant is the largest in Baylor's history and one of the largest awarded in the Southwest, Gary Carter, director of research administration, said Wednesday.

Dr. Merle Alexander, professor of physics and director of the Institute of Environmental Studies, will be the

chief investigator for the 10-12 year study.

Alexander's proposal to study various aspects of comet dust was selected from a field of several hundred submitted to the National Aeronautics and Space Administration last fall.

Nine grants were awarded for experiments to be conducted on the mission titled Comet Rendezvous and Asteroid Flyby, set for the 1990s.
