Cowboys, Walker run over Cardinals

IRVING (AP) - Dallas quarterback Danny White, who was start ing for the first time in a month, and Herschel Walker made it a lousy homecoming for St. Louis Coach Gene Stallings.

The Cowboys used White's two touchdown passes and Walker's 120 yards rushing and two touchdowns en route to a 37-6 victory over the Cardinals Sunday.

Stallings was an assistant under Dallas Coach Tom Landry for 14 years and it was his first appearance in Texas Stadium as an NFL head coach. Landry had given his former pupil a 31-7 losing lesson when the two teams met in St. Louis last

"It was nice being back in Texas Stadium again, but I didn't like the result one bit," Stallings said. "We just got whipped and we don't have any excuses. The Cowboys are even a better team now than the one we played earlier. Danny White was

Dallas increased its record to 6-2, a half-game behind division-leading Washington in the NFC, while the

Washington in the NFC, while the Cardinals dropped to 1-7. White played only in the first half, throwing a 36-yard touchdown pass to rookie Mike Sherrard and a 20-yard scoring shot to Tony Hill as Dallas rolled to a 27-6 halftime lead.

Raiders sack Oilers, win 5th straight game

HOUSTON (AP) — Los Angeles quarterback Marc Wilson threw four touchdown passes, three to tight end Todd Christensen, and the Raider defense sacked Houston quarterback Warren Moon six times and intercepted four passes en route to a 28-17 NFL victory Sunday.

The Raiders, 5-3, won their fifth straight game after three straight losses and took advantage of the Oil-ers' first-half miscues for a 21-7 lead at intermission.

The Raiders played the game without their leading rusher, Marcus Allen, sidelined with an ankle injury. Rookie Napoleon McCallum subbed with 82 yards on 22 carries.

Moon was sacked twice, threw two interceptions, lost a fumble and had

five passes tipped in the Oilers' er-ror-filled first half.

Moon was sacked four more times in the second half although Houston rallied with Tony Zendejas' 48-yard field goal and a 4-yard touchdown run by Mike Rozier in the third quar-

The Oilers were penalized 11 times for 80 yards, including eight infractions for 65 yards in the first

Wilson hit Andy Parker with a 2-yard touchdown pass in the first quarter, aided by Rod Martin's interception and two penalties against the Oilers.

Christensen got behind Oiler linebacker John Grimsley for second quarter touchdown passes of 14 yards and 32 yards.
