






Entrepreneurs plan to capitalize on Texas' 'Best Little Whorehouse'

LA GRANGE (AP) - Two businessmen want to sell square-inch parcels of land from the site of the Chicken Ranch, the bordello immortalized in "The Best Little Whorehouse in Texas," and use the proceeds to build a museum.

The bordello, officially called Ed-na's Fashionable Ranch Boarding House, operated at the site for more than a century. It got its nickname in the Depression, when chickens were accepted as payment for services.

Land purchasers will receive a le-gal deed and free admission to a lanned museum on the property, due to be built by next summer.

"It's really a piece of history," said Todd Hoffman, president of The Original Chicken Ranch Inc. "It will be like a national monument. It will be first class, a place to bring the wife and kids." The bawdiness will be down-

played at the museum and no liquor will be sold, he said.

"It's going to be tasteful," said Bob Burns, Hoffman's partner.

For \$8 — the price one would have paid in the 1950s for a night with one of the ranch's prostitutes a person can own a square-inch parcel of the land just east of this central Texas town, the businessmen said.

The museum will feature some original furnishings but mainly reproductions of the interior decor of the famed farmhouse. It will be built in part with wood remaining from the original bordello but will be patterned on another, more elaborate residence.

"The original structure was methat attractive," Hoffman sail "What we're really selling is not be house, but the history and story

The men also plan to sell Chick Ranch souvenirs.

The bordello operated in Grange, relatively undisturbed authorities, for some 130 years to fore then-Gov. Dolph Briscoe dos it down in 1973 after a series of the vision news reports about the opera


