



Leonard, the former welterweight and junior middleweight champ, is guaranteed \$11 million for the fight, while Hagler, the undisputed middlewight king, has a \$12 million

ure wight king, has a \$12 infinite guarantee. The guarantees are the largest in boxing history. "The original deal, which Leon-ard did not accept, would have paid him \$8 million plus 30 percent of the revenue in excess of \$25 million," promoter Bob Arum said at a news conference. "He opted instead to be bought out of the percentage for \$3

million. If the fight does over \$30 million, he lost money. If it does un-der \$30 million, he made money. It was a businessman's decision.

"Marvin gets 50-75 percent of rev-enue over \$25 million." Arum said the fight, set for April 6 at Caesars Palace in Las Vegas, Nev., could have a potential closed circuit and pay-per-view audience of 3 million and might gross as much as \$100 million. \$100 million. That would double the previous record gross set by heavy-weights Larry Holmes and Gerry Cooney at Caesars in 1982.

Closed circuit tickets went on sale at New York's Radio City Music Hall Monday at \$60 each. The 15,000seat arena at Caesars is scaled with a \$700 top price and a sellout will yield \$7,867,100 from the live gate.
