

# SMU officials suspend Reese after further allegations

DALLAS (AP) — Southern Methodist officials said Tuesday that tight end Albert Reese will be suspended for a second game following more allegations that he received illegal benefits from a booster.

In another development, Mustang Club board member Frank Roby said he is resigning because of frustration over the "air of mystery" surrounding the workings of the SMU athletic department.

The Dallas Morning News reported Tuesday that Reese's utility bills were paid by a company with ties to George Owen, a Dallas developer also accused of providing a free apartment for the senior.

SMU Athletic Director Bob Hitch said the decision to suspend Reese was difficult because the Saturday game against Arkansas would have been his last collegiate performance.

Reese was suspended from last Saturday's game against Texas Tech because of allegations that Owen supplied him with a rent-free apartment. Owen denies the charge.

Reese, the Mustang's starting tight end, said he was deeply disappointed.

"I'm paying for the apartment and I have a hard time understanding why I am not being allowed to play this weekend," he said in a written statement. "But I understand SMU's position, support their decision and look forward to the investigation of this issue to be completed."

Roby said Monday that the booster club had not been kept informed of current events. "Until they do something about the system, I'm out," Roby said.

"We're the ones they go to and say, 'OK, guys, let's work harder to make this up. We're running short of money,'" Roby said. "Yet we have never been consulted on financial decisions at all — where the money goes and why."

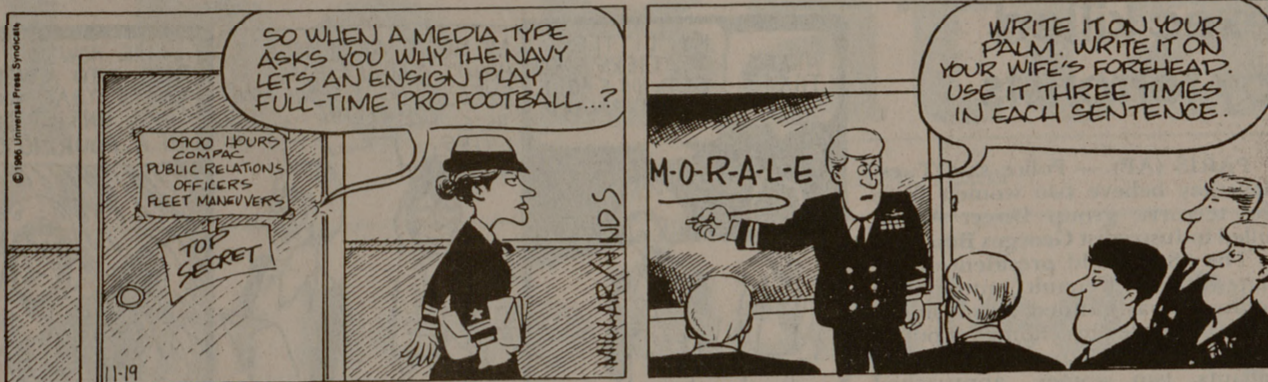
On Monday, an NCAA committee agreed to SMU's request to delay action on a probationary appeal until recent charges of continuing violations at the school are investigated.

Athletic Director Bob Hitch and faculty representative Lonnie Kliever requested the postponement before the NCAA Committee on Infractions in Kansas City. The committee voted unanimously to postpone the appeal.

Kliever asked the panel to delay action on SMU's appeal of last year's restrictions on its football scholarships until the player payoff charges "are fully investigated and finally resolved."

# Trailblazers burn Rockets with 115-111 overtime win

HOUSTON (AP) — Kiki Vandeweghe scored six of his 23 points in the final 1:18 of overtime to lead the Portland Trail Blazers to a 115-111 win over the Houston Rockets Tuesday night at the Summit.

With Houston leading 110-107, Vandeweghe took charge, sinking four of three free throws and a field goal as Portland won its fourth straight. Caldwell Jones added a pair of free throws with one second left to secure the win.

Steve Johnson led the Trail Blazers with a season-high 24 points.

With both of Houston's twin towers, Akeem Olajuwon and Ralph Sampson, out of the game and the score tied 88-88, Mitchell Wiggins hit nine straight points to boost Houston to a 97-91 lead with 2:10 left in regulation play.

Houston held on to a 103-101 margin when Terry Porter hit a bas-

ket with three seconds left in regulation, sending the game into overtime.

Portland outscored Houston 12-3 in the first 3½ minutes of the fourth quarter to take a 86-84 lead. After tying the score 86-86 with a pair of free throws, Olajuwon fouled out with 7:32 left to play.

Sampson left the game with 3:38 to play in the second quarter with a sprained ankle.

Robert Reid led Houston with 21

points followed by Rodney McCray and Wiggins with 18 and 17, respectively. Olajuwon finished with 16.

Houston, 5-3, led 16-10 midway through the first quarter and 30-27 going into the second period.

Portland, 5-5, led 50-49 at the half and increased their lead to 63-56 early in the third quarter before Houston scored seven straight to tie the game 63-63.

# Lakers down Mavs, 114-110

DALLAS (AP) — Earvin "Magic" Johnson scored 29 points to lead the Los Angeles to a come-from-behind 114-110 victory over the Dallas Mavericks Tuesday night.

Johnson put the Lakers (6-1)

ahead 101-100, when he made one of two free throws with 4:03 left in the game. Los Angeles had trailed since late in the third period. The 6-9 guard scored nine points in a three and one-half minute span as the Lakers increased their lead to 107-102 with 1:43 left in the game.

Dallas (5-5) managed to tie the game at 107 on Derek Harper's three-point basket and Mark Aguirre's turnaround jumper, but the Lakers went ahead for good 109-107 on Johnson's two free throws.

Aguirre, who led Dallas with 26 points, had sparked a Mavericks' third period in which they overcame a two-point halftime deficit to lead 86-83 entering the final period.

The Lakers, who led 61-59 at halftime, outscored the Mavericks, 11-4, overcoming a 45-44 Dallas lead to go ahead, 55-49, with 5:01 left in the second quarter. Johnson was instrumental in the run, scoring six points and handing out an assist to Michael Cooper.

Aguirre kept Dallas in the game, scoring 14 of the Mavericks' 23 points in the quarter. The Mavericks tied the game at 59 with 14 seconds left in the half, but Johnson hit a 14-footer with two seconds remaining.
