



**Jury denied access to Laredo police info**

LAREDO (AP) — A state district judge has agreed to quash a grand jury subpoena that sought all police department personnel and internal affairs records dating back five years.

"The subpoena is over-broad and there are no procedural safeguards. It's a fishing expedition. The grand jury is using their subpoena power as a tool for discovery to allow a broad, sweeping investigation."

Jurors had demanded the records Nov. 12 as part of their inquiry into criminal complaints against some police officers, but city and police officials protested that the subpoena was too broad, vague and an invasion of privacy.

Despite the judge's decision, however, Assistant District Attorney Ana Laura Cavazos says the investigation into the police department will continue.

Judge Elma Salinas Ender sided with the city Monday, but said she'd be glad to assist the jurors in drawing up a new subpoena when they meet again later this week.

"We believe that the court cannot interfere with the functioning of the grand jury," Cavazos said. "Grand jury proceedings are secret even to the judge. She does not have the authority to tell them to come to her and tell her what they want."

City Attorney Anthony McGettrick said the subpoena violated the rights of police officers who agree to testify in departmental investigations with the understanding that they not be criminally prosecuted for their statements.

Cavazos wouldn't discuss specific subject matter, but she said the investigation began after her office received several complaints.

Laredo Police Officers Association attorney James Morris said,

Several officers of the Laredo Police Officers Association have claimed that Police Chief Victor Garcia didn't properly prosecute a suspect in the slaying of a fellow officer.

**Judge refused to suspend tree cutting**

HOUSTON (AP) — A judge Tuesday refused to suspend U.S. Forest Service from cutting trees in a controversial plan to clear areas of Sam Houston National Forest damaged by pine beetles.

U.S. District Judge Lynn Hughes denied a request to suspend a temporary restraining order pending the outcome of a lawsuit by Texas Attorney General Jim

tox. The lawsuit asks that the study of the project be required to determine whether work should proceed.

After the ruling, Forest Service officials said the area was safe from recent rainfall and they were not sure when they would proceed with the operation.

A Dec. 9 hearing also was scheduled Tuesday for a preliminary injunction to again try and stop the tree-cutting operation.


