"The melody and the lyrics kind of come at the same time," he says. "Sometimes I'll have an idea, but it's real hard for me to write from an idea. I spend too much time thinking about the idea, working to fit stuff in around that idea, that I can't get a really good straightforward song out of it."

Bean says the group's name was originally the Jets, but they found out that the name was already taken by some other bands, so they came up with the Judy's.

"We kind of liked something that started

with a J," Bean says with a laugh. "We liked the way your mouth has to make the J."

The Judy's had their first gig in 1980 when they played at a school dance. At the time they were promoting themselves as a punk rock group, a concept which drew different reactions from their peers.

"We did this thing where we were throwing around beef liver," Bean says. "Some people laughed at us because we were kind of different, and then some people thought we were kind of cool."

In retrospect, Bean says regardless of their popularity, the experience was worthwhile for the band members.

"It was real cool for us because we were getting to do something that most people in high school weren't doing, which was having a band and playing in clubs," he says.

According to Bean, some of the high points of the Judy's musical career were opening in Houston for the B-52's in 1980 and the Talking Heads in 1981, and again for the B-52's in 1981 during a six-

city tour through Louisiana and Texas.

He says future plans for the group include recording more albums and constantly changing their onstage performances.

"The look and feel of the band is quite different from what it was previously and we're just going to get better and more exciting," he says.

"Thursday will be the first time we're playing with the new line-up, but it's on a really small stage in a small club in Nacogdoches, so Friday is going to be the first time we're going to be in a real show

setting with the new line-up," he says.

Tonight's performance will be the Judy's third in the area. They played at Dr. G's when they came to College Station in 1984, and again at La Fiesta in 1985.

The concert, sponsored by MSC Town Hall, promises to be a doozy.

Tim Hein, Town Hall vice-chairman, says no chairs will be set up on the floor so people can dance, but there are bleachers to sit on.

Tickets are \$4 and are available at Rudder Box Office and at the door.
