## Twins name manager for next year

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — Tom Kelly, who replaced fired Minnesota Twins Manager Ray Miller on an in-terim basis Sept. 12, on Monday was amed manager for 1987

Kelly, 36, the Twins' third-base oach since 1983, becomes the first ative Minnesotan to manage the eam since the franchise moved from Washington in 1961. He is the 1th manager in Twins history.



Ralph Houk, 67, who managed the New York Yankees, Detroit Tigers and Boston Red Sox, was named vice president, baseball; Bob Gebhard, 43, a former wins pitcher and the farm director f the Montreal Expos for the past ive years, was named director of najor league personnel; and vice resident Andy MacPhail was med executive vice president, aseball operations.

Miller was fired when the Twins are in the American League West asement with a 59-80 record. Kelly uided the team to a 12-11 record e rest of the season.

Kelly, who was born in Graceville, Minn., and now lives in Parlins, N.J., pent most of his 13 professional playing seasons in the minor leagues before becoming one of the most successful minor-league managers in the history of the Minnesota organi-

Marino completed 29 of 36, in an uncharacteristic short-passing ball-control game that kept the ball for almost two-thirds of the game and kept the explosive New York offense off the field. He hit Nat Moore with 22- and 21-yarders and threw for 1yard scores to Hampton and Bruce Hardy as Miami scored on seven of its first eight poseesions.
