Announcement could come today

**UT may name McWilliams coach**

AUSTIN (AP) — Texas Tech football Coach David McWilliams may be named as the new head coach at the University of Texas as soon as today, the *Austin American-Statesman* reported Wednesday.

Also, Texas Tech Athletic Director T. Jones told reporters, "I would say, yes, they probably will (offer McWilliams the job)."

The newspaper said sources indicated that Arizona State Coach John Cooper also has been interviewed for the job which became vacant on Saturday when UT fired 10-year coach Fred Akers.

But the newspaper said, "UT officials and alumni say it's becoming more and more obvious that Athletic Director DeLoss Dodds will make an

offer to McWilliams perhaps as soon as today (Wednesday)."

Dodds, in an interview Tuesday night, said no offers had been made yet. He declined to say how many candidates he has spoken with.

The *American-Statesman* said Akers' successor would be introduced at a press conference, maybe as early as Thursday, because Dodds said he wanted to "get it done by the end of the week."

Dodds said he discusses the situation with university President Bill Cunningham daily and will make a recommendation to him before offering the job to any candidate.

Asked about speculation that McWilliams, a former UT player and assistant coach, is the front-runner, Dodds replied: "I can't control what

people have on TV and radio. Sometimes they speculate right, sometimes they speculate wrong."

McWilliams said he talked with Dodds on Sunday. "There was no job offer," McWilliams said. "He indicated he had some other people he would visit with."

McWilliams moved to Texas Tech this season and led the Red Raiders to a 7-4 record and Independence Bowl bid.

Dodds said he has discussed the job with "more than one" candidate. He would not identify the others.

Tech's Jones told reporters Tuesday he didn't know whether McWilliams would accept the job if offered. He predicted it would be a tough decision.

"His family is involved. His

friends are involved. He'll look at his profession, his age, he wants out of his career," said.

Jones said he would make an attempt to counter a UT offer if one be made.

Several other names besides Williams and Cooper have been mentioned as possibilities for Longhorn job, including Smith of Arizona, Fisher of Air Force, Mike Shanahan, assistant with the Denver Broncos, Allen Lowry, a Dallas Cowboys tight end.

Meanwhile, the *American-Statesman* also reported Wednesday that Akers had been contacted by the University.

**Gildner, Spence receive SWC honors**

Texas A&M seniors Stacey Gildner and Margaret Spence have been named to the 1986 All-Southwest Conference Volleyball Team.

The conference's six head coaches selected the squad that included Eva Murray, Karen Kramer and Diane Watson of Texas, as well as Lara Epperson of Rice. It was Spence's second straight selection to the team.

Murray, who lead the Longhorns to their fifth straight SWC crown, was named Player of the Year, while Houston's Sherri Byer was given Newcomer of the Year honors.

Rice's Debbie Sokol was unanimously chosen as Coach of the Year for turning a 0-10 1985 Owl team

into a third-place finisher this year.

Gildner finished the year with a team-leading .248 hitting percentage, while Spence was a close second in the category with a .230.

The two seniors were key offensive figures on an A&M team that finished second in the conference and gained a berth in the NCAA playoffs.

Second-team honors went to Beyer, Jana Ranley of Baylor, Jackie Campbell and Dawn Davenport of Texas, Becky Boxwell of Texas Tech and Ana Epperson of Rice.

The Aggies will face Georgia in the first round of the NCAA playoffs Friday night in Georgia.

**Mourners gather to pay homage to Layne**

LUBBOCK (AP) — Family, friends and former teammates of Bobby Layne gathered Wednesday to mourn the death of the Hall of Fame quarterback.

The 59-year-old Layne, who played for the University of Texas, the Detroit Lions and Pittsburgh Steelers among other teams, had made his home in Lubbock for many years. He died Monday after a lengthy illness.

More than 450 people packed into St. Paul's Episcopal Church for funeral services. Private

burial rites were held later in the City of Lubbock Cemetery.

The Rev. Harold O. Clinehens Jr., rector of St. Paul's Church, declined to read a eulogy for Layne, saying many others present were more qualified to eulogize Layne and "Bobby wouldn't want one."

Layne's teammates including four Hall of Famers — Doak Walker, a friend and teammate of Layne's dating back to junior high, Joe Schmidt, Yale Lary and Ernie Stautner — recalled their days with Layne.

"He was a friend," Walker said, choking on emotion.

"He was the greatest two-minute quarterback ever."

Stautner, a Layne teammate with the Steelers, remembered him as a great competitor.

"He never believed he could lose," Stautner said. "He said he didn't lose, time just ran out on him."

"He had the ability to infect the team with the same attitude."
