Officials may recommend mandatory AIDS blood test

ATLANTA (AP) — Federal health officials, worried by an increase in AIDS among heterosexuals, said Tuesday they may recommend that AIDS blood tests be mandatory for all patients admitted to hospitals and even couples applying for marriage licenses.

The test for antibodies to the AIDS virus now is required only for blood donors.

The federal Centers for Disease Control has invited 250 public health officials to Atlanta for a public hearing to discuss its proposal, Dr. Walter Dowdle, the CDC's AIDS director, said.

Those invited to the hearing Feb. 24-25 include members of civil liberties groups, who may oppose the proposal, Dowdle said.

The CDC will decide after the hearing whether to make a formal proposal about expanded testing for AIDS. Such a recommendation that state hospitals or government agencies make the tests mandatory would not be binding, Dowdle said.

"What the meeting is really about is to explore the issues related to using the test to prevent further infection," he said. "We're looking for a public forum. We're saying these are the ways the test might be used. Here are the justifications, here are the obstacles."

One obstacle, he said, could be a concern over confidentiality. Hospitals and government agencies would have to ensure that test results remain secret to prevent discrimination against AIDS carriers, he said.

He said the proposal is being considered now because tests for exposure to the AIDS virus have proven highly accurate and because the

number of Americans who have contracted AIDS through heterosexual contact has risen from only 10 in 1981 to 4 percent of the more than 30,000 confirmed cases now.

Of those confirmed cases, half have died, according to figures.

Dowdle said the CDC is proposing that a person who tests positive for the AIDS antibody be required to undergo a blood test before applying for a marriage license. But that test would provide an opportunity for counseling and protection for the infected potential partner and future children, he said.

Mandatory AIDS antibody testing of people routinely admitted to hospitals "would provide the public with information that may be related to the way he cares for his patient," Dowdle said.

Acquired immune deficiency syndrome is an incurable disease transmitted through an exchange of body fluids that attacks the immune system, leaving victims susceptible to a wide variety of infections and cancers.

Senate OKs state raises speed limit

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate voted Tuesday to let states raise speed limits along sparsely settled stretches of interstate highways to 65 mph, setting up a clash with the House that could delay distribution of billions of dollars of federal transportation aid.

The speed limit increase, approved 65-33, was an amendment to the \$52.4 billion highway bill, which would provide assistance to road and bridge projects in the states for the next four years. A \$10.8 billion package of mass transit assistance is expected to be added to the bill.

A \$91 billion highway and transit bill passed by the House last month would retain the 55 mph speed limit, and Rep. James Howard, D-N.J., chairman of the House Public Works and Transportation Committee, has said he favors 55 mph.

Thus, the two chambers could be heading toward a replay of last fall's standoff, when a highway and transit aid package died in a Senate-House conference committee. One reason was that senators on that committee insisted on the higher speed limit while representatives refused.

"I want to get the bill passed, and I want to get it through conference and get it on the president's desk," Senate Majority Leader Robert Byrd, D-W.Va., said before Tuesday's vote. Byrd voted against the higher speed limit last year.

The Senate approved an identical 65 mph measure last year by a 56-36 vote.

Most support for increasing the limit came from Western legislators, who argued that higher speeds should be allowed on long, isolated sections of road. Opponents, mainly Easterners, have insisted that the lower speed saves lives and conserves gasoline.

World Briefs

Reagan's communication chief resigns

WASHINGTON (AP) — Patrick J. Buchanan, President Reagan's combative chief of communications, added his name Tuesday to a growing list of administration resignations, saying he could work for conservative causes more effectively outside the White House.

Buchanan, who announced last month that he would not run for president, has seemed frustrated in his two-year campaign to get the administration to follow a hardline conservative script.

He will join an exodus of top administration officials departing with two years left in the administration.

Some people delayed their departure, Fitzwater said, because of the Iranian situation. He was referring to the controversy over the secret sale of arms to Nicaraguan rebels.

In addition, Reagan has lost longtime spokesman, Larry Speakes and his deputy, Fred Rousell; CIA Director William Casey; political adviser Michael Daniels; Cabinet secretary Albert King; drug-abuse adviser Gordon Turner; and the president's doctor, T. Burton Smith.

Brezhnev's kin accused of bribe-taking

MOSCOW (AP) — In another move to combat top-level corruption, the Soviet government announced Tuesday the late President Leonid I. Brezhnev's son-in-law had been arrested and accused of taking bribes.

Foreign Ministry spokesman Gennady Gerasimov announced the arrest of Yuri Churbanov, a former deputy interior minister, during a briefing for reporters.

The official Tass news agency also carried a one-sentence announcement of the arrest, suggesting the government was planning to make an example of Churbanov for alleged abuse of his authority.

Neither of the announcements mentioned Churbanov's relationship with Brezhnev, who was Soviet leader from 1964 to his death in November 1982.

But bribe-taking and corruption during Brezhnev's tenure have come under harsh criticism in the past two years.

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Commerce Department said Tuesday its main economic forecasting gauge soared 2.1 percent in December, the biggest increase in four years, but economists split on whether the performance signaled a reviving economy.

The gain in the Index of Leading Indicators in December was the fourth in a row and followed advances of 0.7 percent in October and 0.9 percent in November.

The 2.1 percent rise in the leading indicators was the biggest one-month increase since a 2.1 percent surge in January 1983.

Michael Evans, head of Washington forecasting unit, said he saw no evidence the economy has emerged from its general slump of the past two years.

"Much of the strength came from year-end tax buying," he said.

The Institute for Pacific Asia has been established by the Texas A&M University System Board of Regents in order to promote and coordinate research and instructional programs and facilitate the creation and exchange of knowledge and ideas among scientists, scholars, and students of selected institutions of higher education and research in the Pacific Asia region and those at Texas A&M University.
