Statistics show most parolees from Texas stay out of jail

HOUSTON (AP) — Of the inmates paroled from Texas prisons, 67 percent stay out of jail — two percentage points better than the national average, according to statistics from the state Board of Pardons and Paroles.

"It's not really a question of whether the system works or not," said John Byrd, executive director of the board. "Because we deal with human beings, we have to deal with both success and failure."

The actions of the parole board have come under closer scrutiny recently as the Texas Department of Corrections tries to cope with a crowding problem that triggered a shutdown of the nation's second-largest prison system.

One inmate recently released was a model parolee with a record of only petty crimes. But following his release, he kidnapped a woman and child, killed the woman and a Texas Ranger before he was killed by the slain Ranger's partner.

"Unfortunately, the public perception is with those cases that make headlines," Byrd told the *Houston Post*. The parole board will accept

responsibility for decisions that were wrong, but most decisions are good ones, he says.

Consider Anthony "Wildcat" Wiley, who spent two years in the Sugar Land Unit.

"I've seen people with their throats cut, seen people stabbed while taking a shower, seen people scalded with hot water," Wiley says. "I was very lucky. And I'm not going back."

Wiley, convicted of aggravated robbery in 1982, says that once deprived of his freedom, deprived of the chance to hold his wife in his arms and deprived of the opportunity to watch his son grow up, he was determined to get out of prison.

"I feel fortunate that I had someone waiting on me," he said of his family. "I don't feel I could take them through it again."

For other inmates, the fear is how they will be accepted.

Parole board figures show 73 percent of the inmates released — 30,384 — have no job, lack job skills or are having problems finding or holding a job.

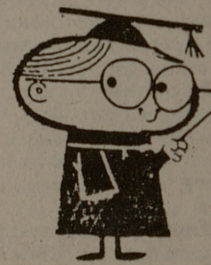
