

Uniquely titled art of A&M employee on display in CS

"The Child Picked up his Crayon and Discovered the Universe" and "Don't Leave Me Yet Grossmutter, I've Too Much to Learn" are two of 28 unusually titled pieces of Kent Manske's artwork on display at the College Station Community Center until the end of March.

Manske, 27, is a graphics designer for the Texas A&M Department of Educational Information Services. He has exhibited his works in the Bryan-College Station area since June 1986 when he began working at A&M. His works have been displayed at the Brazos Center and at the MSC Gallery.

Of all his pieces Manske says his favorite is "The Child Picked up his Crayon and Discovered the Universe." "I'm the child, and these are all my interests," he says. "I have so many child-like behaviors about learning that I had to portray it. It was fun for me."

Some of his other unusual titles are "Stupid Appliances and Nuclear Waste" and "Earth News." Both are statements about society, he says.

"Go," which he says characterizes forgotten responsibilities and obligations, is the piece he had the most fun creating.

Manske's works, he says, reflect his ideas, emotions and philosophies.

A lot of his work deals with his frustrations as an artist, he says. "I can't make a living by just my fine art work," he says. "The term 'starving artist' is a very true thing."

Manske received a bachelor's degree in fine arts from the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire. Designing publications for the University sparked his interest in creative design, he says.

Manske came to Texas "on an irresponsible road trip," he says. After working in Galveston for an advertising firm, he says he wanted to experiment more with his own style, so he opened a graphics design studio in Austin.

After four years in Austin, he came to College Station because he likes working in a university environment, he says.

Although his job with A&M stimulates him, Manske says he doesn't take his work home. Even after working 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., he still has time to do his artwork.

The piece in his collection that best describes him, Manske says, is titled "A Tie for Profit, a Coat for Fun, Flannel for Life, I Want So to Live but I Breathe Unrealistic Deadlines."

West Texas leaders attempt to get supercollider project

SAN ANGELO (AP) — West Texas leaders think Gov. Bill Clements is wrong to suggest more metropolitan parts of the state are better sites to attract the supercollider research project, an official said Wednesday.

San Angelo Mayor Burt Terrill said backers of his Garden City site, located between Big Spring, Midland and San Angelo, think it's just as attractive as locations near Dallas-

Fort Worth, or the Austin-Houston-Bryan area.

Clements leaves for Washington Friday for a national governor's conference. He has said his top priority will be to draw the multibillion dollar physics research project to Texas.

The Department of Energy supercollider is expected to employ about 3,000 people and generate an annual budget of \$270 million.

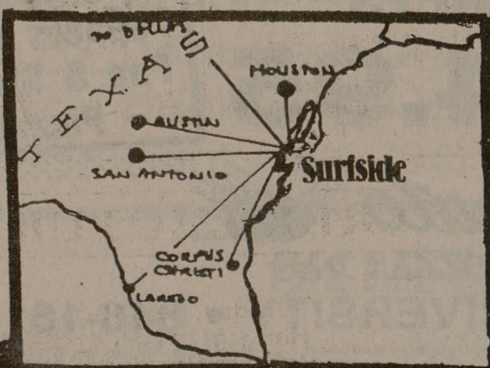
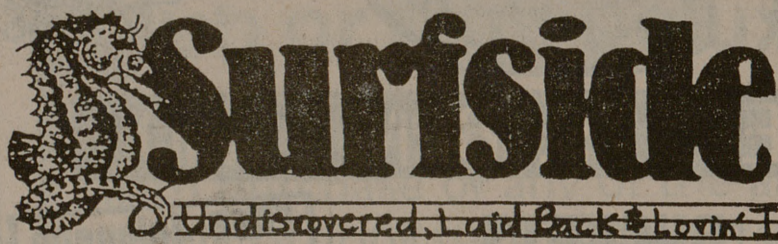
