Despite an inspired comeback, A&M dropped a 63-57 decision o Arkansas Wednesday night at G. Rollie White Coliseum. The Lady Aggies, 9-16 overall and 5-10 in the Southwest Conference, must beat Baylor Saturday to reb the final section the text rab the final spot in the tourna-

"We have improved so much," A&M Coach Lynn Hickey said. They proved that they could ave beaten the No. 2 team in the onference. If you can stay up ith Arkansas, you can stay up ith most clubs.

The Razorbacks improved to 5-11 and 11-4.

"The difference was we were ble to score inside," Arkansas oach John Sutherland said.

The Lady Aggies, behind the coring of Evelyn Sanders and Paula Crutcher, jumped out to a quick 10-6 lead. After Sanders hit spinning eight-footer in the paint for A&M's 10th point, Ar-ansas began to press. It payed off a quick dividend as Lanell awson stole an in-bounds pass nd scored to make it 10-8. A&M still led 14-12 at the

1:27 mark, but Arkansas went ad at 27-18. But the Lady Ages came right back.

Veronda Roundtree canned a -pointer and Roper swished one rom the top of the key to pull ithin five. The Razorbacks man-ged a 32-25 lead into the half.

The Lady Aggies scored the isst basket of the second half to within three at 32-29 but en went cold; Arkansas then owly began to pull away.

TCU dropped to 22-5 and 13-2 the conference while the Cou-ars, who had lost to the Horned

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
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
game as guard Tim Hobby scored 25 points, hitting 9 of 13 shots from the field including five 3point buckets.
