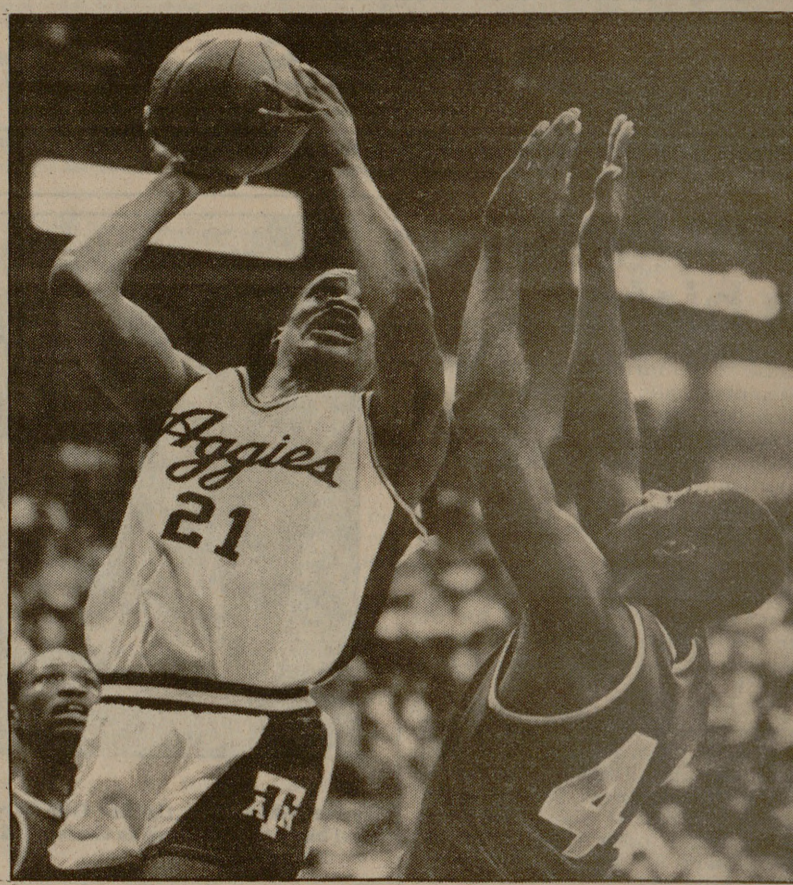

No. 2 Lady Aggies stumble at end of Aggie Invitational

After getting off to a blistering 4-0 start in the Aggie Invitational softball tournament, the second-ranked Texas A&M Lady Aggies lost two games in a row to come away with third place in the tournament held Friday and Saturday at the Southwood Valley Athletic Complex in College Station.
The Lady Aggies were soundly thrashed by defending national champion Cal State Fullerton 5-0 Saturday night in the final game of the tournament.
A win against the Titans would have given A&M first place in the tournament and probably a No. 1 national ranking as well, but the Lady Aggies had to settle for third place because of a 4-0 loss to Louisiana Tech earlier in the day.
Even though both A&M and

Louisiana Tech finished with 4-2 records for the tournament, Louisiana Tech was awarded second place by virtue of its victory over the Lady Aggies.
A&M, 6-2 overall, was red-hot until the Louisiana Tech game Saturday. It defeated Baylor 9-2 in the first game Friday, and then shut out Oklahoma State 3-0 and edged South Carolina 2-1.
Saturday, things looked pretty good for the Lady Aggies again, as A&M squeaked past surprising Sam Houston State 1-0. SHSU shocked Cal State Fullerton 4-2 Friday to hand the Titans their only tournament loss.
Against Louisiana Tech, however, the Lady Aggies fell apart offensively, and the sluggishness carried over into the Cal State Fullerton game, as A&M only had three hits.
