Carrier wins 21-year-old fight for intrastate delivery service

AUSTIN (AP) — A state appeals court Wednesday upheld a Railroad Commission order authorizing United Parcel Service to operate a small-package pickup and delivery service between all points in Texas.

The Legislature intended the Motor Carriers Act to be an exclusive statute only permitting such commercial carrier traffic as expressly authorized by its provisions," he added.

rejected the UPS application. conducted another hearing. courts sent the case back to the commission examiner because testimony from 600 witnesses produced a record in favor of the shipping company.

The appeals court, in an opinion by Justice John Powers, rejected arguments that the commission lacked authority to grant a common-carrier certificate authorizing the manner of statewide pickup and delivery operations proposed by UPS.

UPS began its fight for permission to make deliveries from one point in Texas to another in March 1966. The Railroad Commission initially

Justice Jim Brady's dissenting opinion said the commission's action had, in effect, created a "new class of carriers" by authorizing UPS to deliver freight over irregular routes and schedules.
